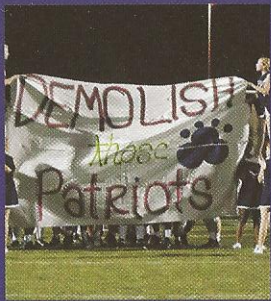


Down, Set, Hut...



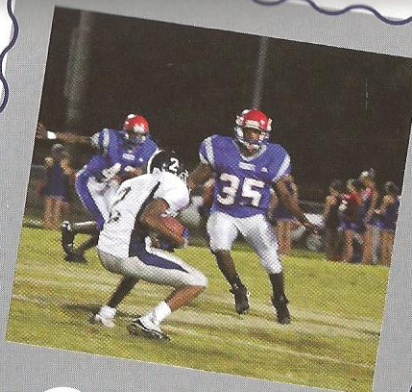
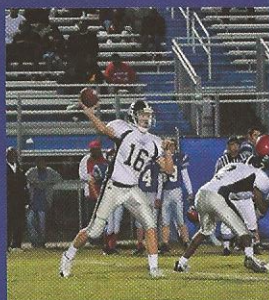

The team was tired from the previous play. They stopped to take a little break. "I choose to play football because my boys were playing and my dad also played back in the day," junior Jamad Pinkney said.

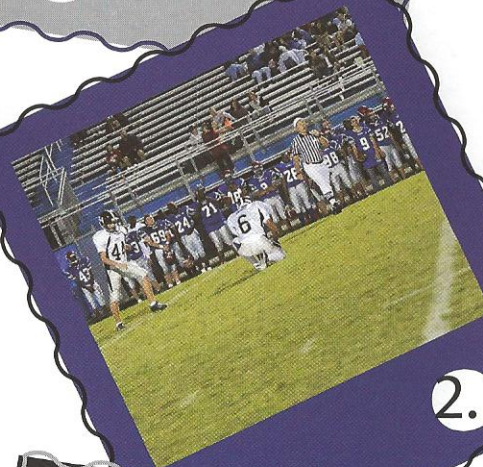

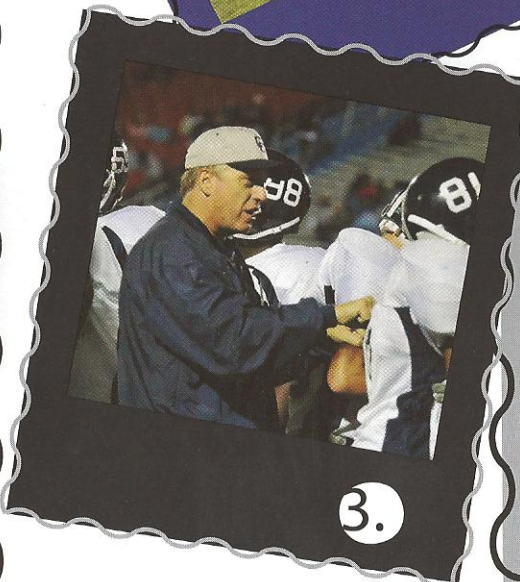
Wightman threw the ball to another teammate during a thursday night game. "My position is Quarterback and I have to be the leader of the team," sophomore Wightman Smoak said.

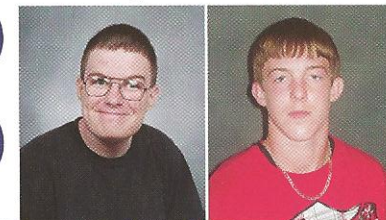
