1. Freshman Johnny Singleton is getting his groove on in the hallway. "I love to perform my talent any time I get the chance to," expressed Johnny.

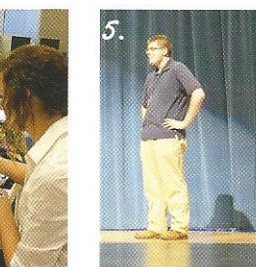


2. Since junior Hannah Houck was six years old, she has been bettering her talent of singing. "I like the feeling, and it is fun," shared Hannah.

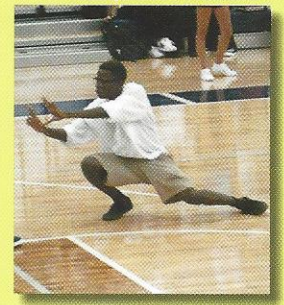
Sophomore Summer Standiford shares her beautiful voice in chorus class. "I think it is really empowering when you can hit the right note and sing through an entire song."
