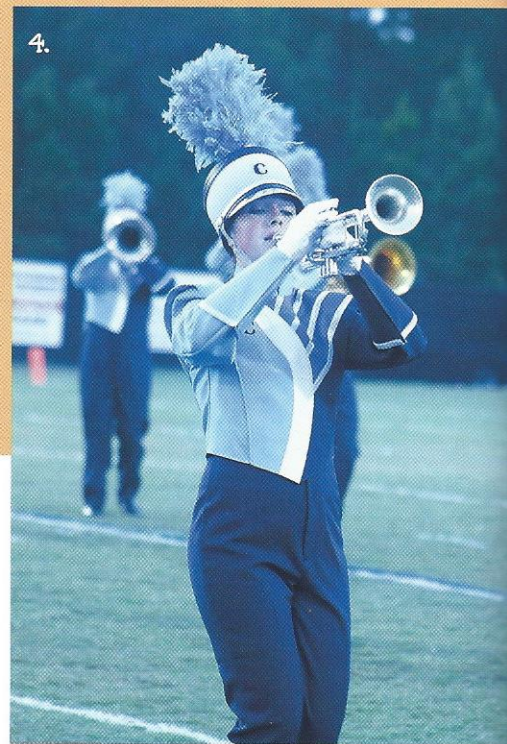


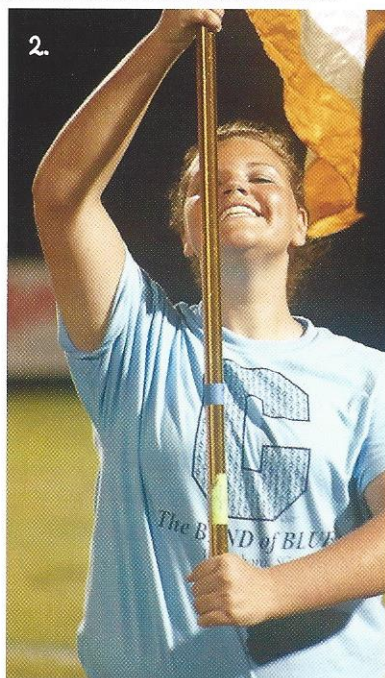
# Capture the Music

1. Junior Jordan Nettles is a second-year, avid band member. "Colorguard; the only activity where you can strip it, flip it, and whip it in public."



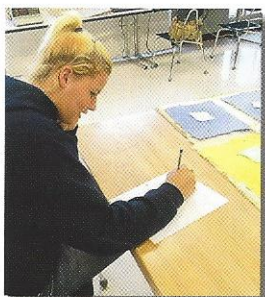
2. Sophomore Alyssa Fender smiles as she hits her mark on the football field during a performance.



3. "Music is my life," explains Junior Adrian Brooks. Adrian is one of the few band members who is honored with a solo.

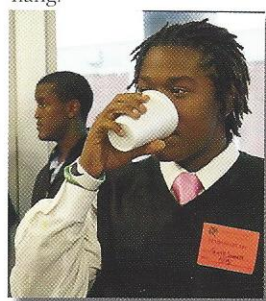
4. With intense focus, senior Victoria Grimsley watches her placement on the field during a routine. "The most important thing about band is the leadership and discipline."
