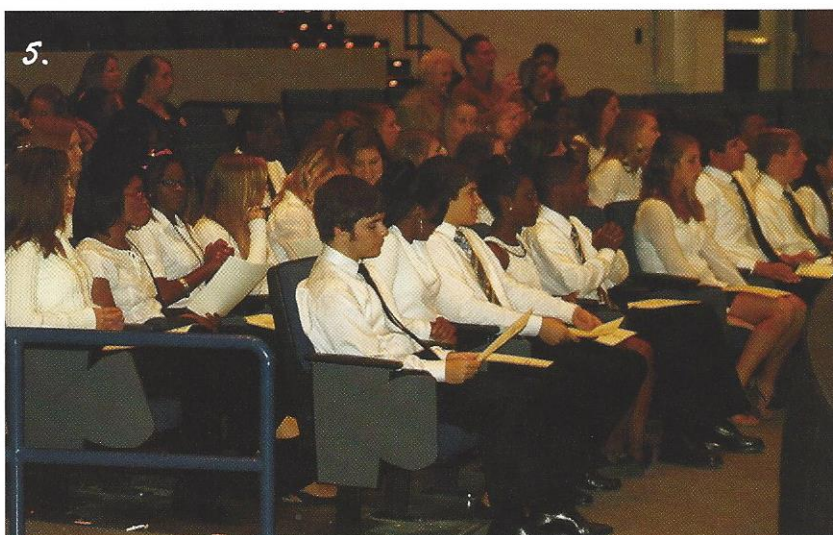
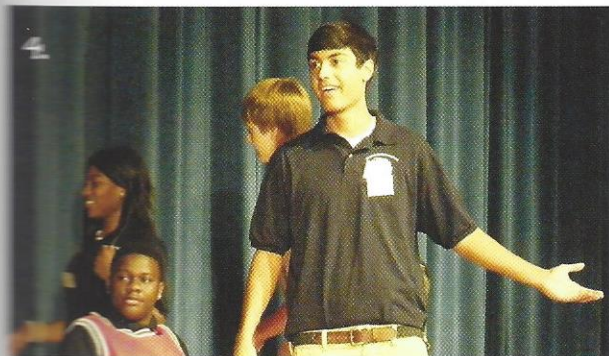
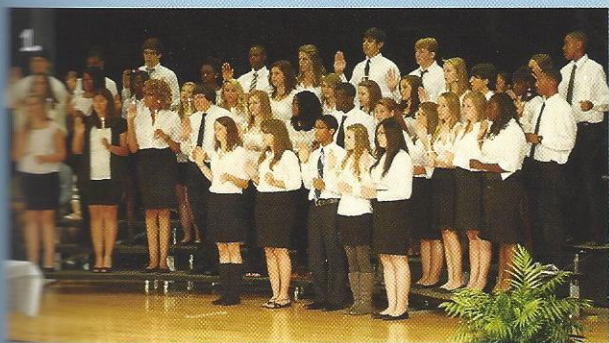


# Gaining the Hours

3. The Officers explain their roles in NHS and elaborate on the true meaning of NHS: scholarship, leadership, and knowledge.

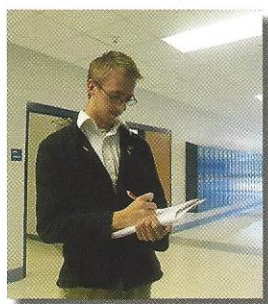
4. Senior Jared O'quinn participates in a skit performed during the summer freshman orientation. Jared was the example of what NOT to do during class time.
