What do you think of when asked about the tenets of CNT?

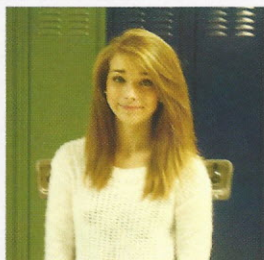
TRUST//

Trust is when someone feels like they are able to rely on you. Sophomore Nick Fanchette says: "Trust is a mutual thing. To be trusted, you must give trust."



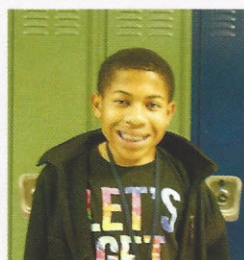
RESPECT//

Joshua Thurman knows that "it's good to be responsible because that will make people like you." Responsibility means you show you are able to complete a task that you've been given.

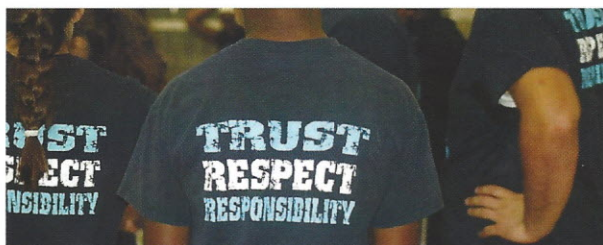


We are One Big Family
