Coach Ryan takes the opportunity for one-on-one instruction as she points out specific strategies to Jorge Caudillo.



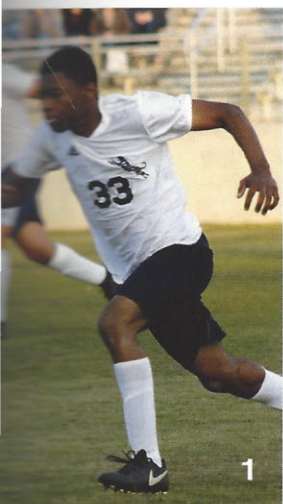
