THE BEAUTY OF AN EVER-DEVELOPING MUSICAL SCORE

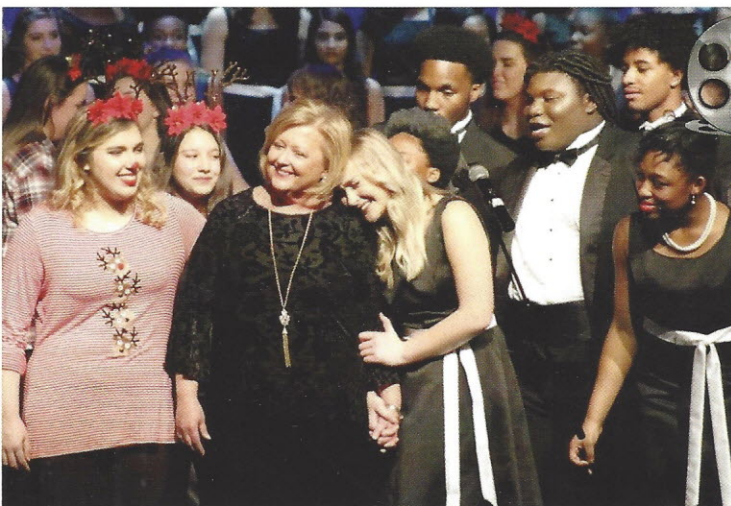

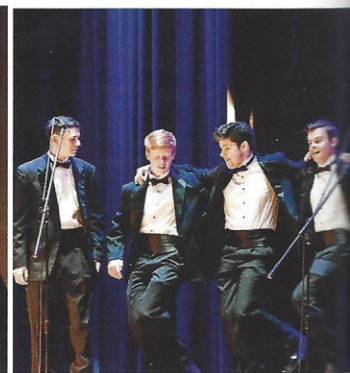
## JUST VISITING
