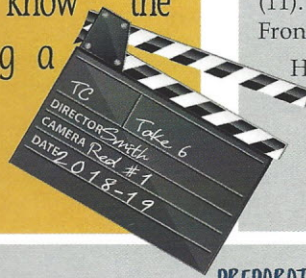


Teacher Cadet

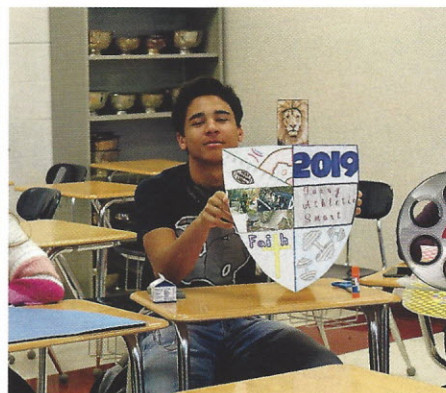
