Senior Cody Peritte and his team listen and learn how to create different designs. Cody says that he likes learning new things and can not wait to see what is next.



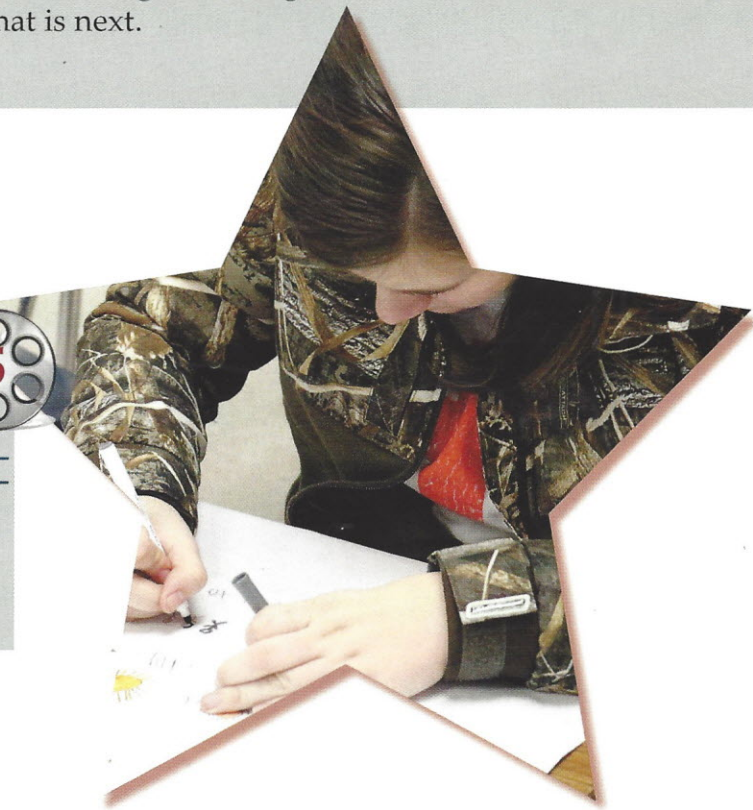
NEW PROJECT
