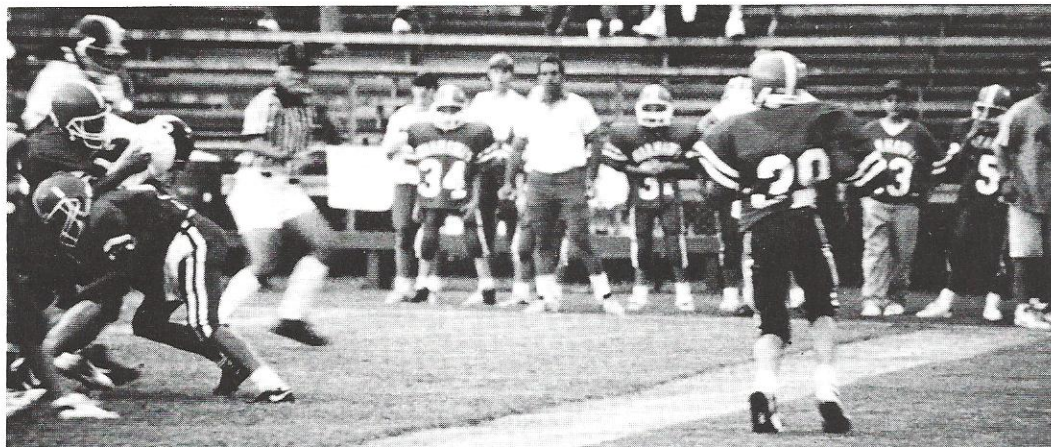
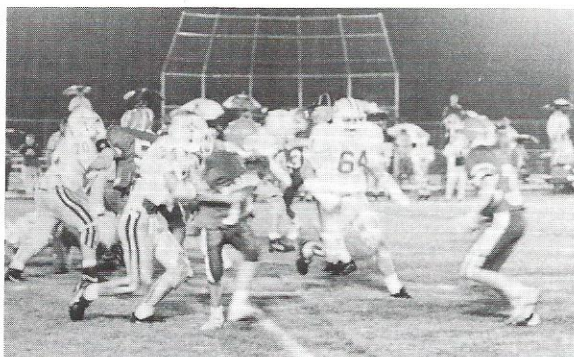


BLOWN BY THE HURRICANES
