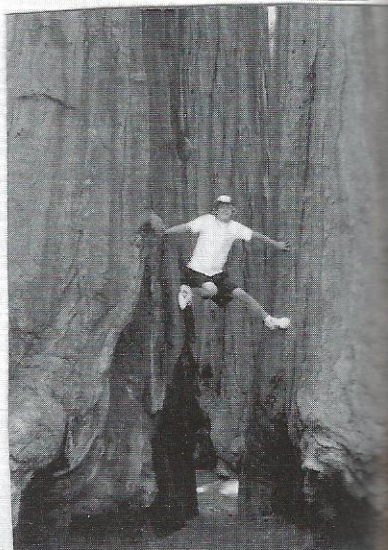
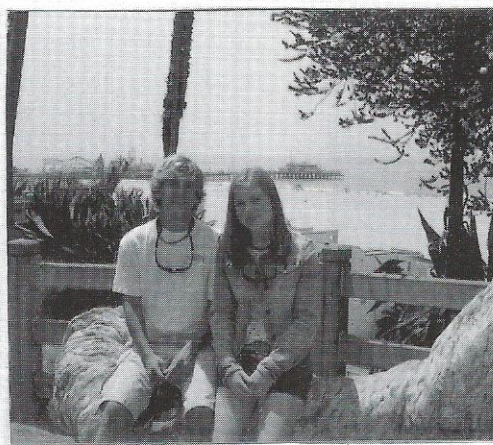
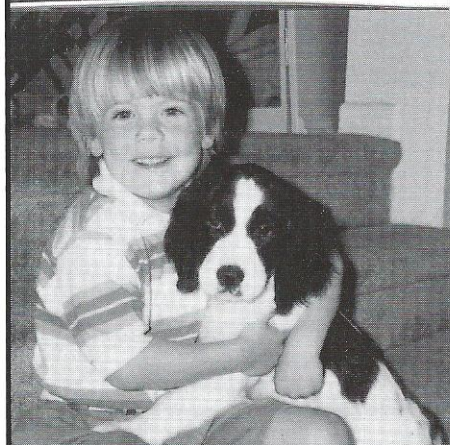


Taylor,
