IN THE EIGHTH GRADE WE BEGAN OUR HIGH SCHOOL LIFE AND ALTHOUGH RATHER GREEN, WE WERE EAGER TO LEARN. THIS GRADE WAS MADE UP OF: ALSTON ACKERMAN, ARCHIE ACKERMAN, HILLIE ACKERMAN, JOE BEN ACKERMAN, MIRIAM ACKERMAN, PERRY ACKERMAN, REMSON ACKERMAN, RUBYE ACKERMAN, JAMES ADAMS, MAGGIE ADAMS, RUTH ADDISON, GLADYS BRIDGE, WILBURN BRIDGE, LOUISE DANDRIDGE, NORMAN DAVIS, BEULAH LEE RERGUSON, ARTHUR HACKER, WILLIAM HIERS, ALLEN HILL, FAIRY HILL, HERBERT HILL, THOMAS HOFF, JIMMIE RHODE, JESSIE SPELL, LEE WESTBROOK, AND PARKER YOUMANS.

OUR NEW SUPERINTENDENT, MR. I. Y. CAUGHMAN, A VERY EFFICIENT MAN, PROVED TO BE AN EXCELLENT SUPERINTENDENT. PROBABLY THE MOST OUTSTANDING EVENT THAT OCCURRED WHILE WE WERE IN THIS GRADE WAS THAT ALL THE SCHOOLS IN COLLETON COUNTY, HAD THE OPPORTUNITY OF SEEING PRESIDENT ROOSEVELT IN CHARLESTON. WE WERE GRADUALLY BECOMING ACCUSTOMED TO HIGH SCHOOL LIFE THROUGH THE HARD SCHOOL OF EXPERIENCE. WHEN WE WERE IN THE NINTH GRADE, WE WON THE LOVING CUP AT THE COUNTY FIELD DAY. WE WERE OVERJOYED AND CONSIDERED THIS QUITE AN HONOR. AS THE SECOND YEAR OF HIGH SCHOOL LIFE CAME TO A CLOSE, WE COULD SCARCELY BELIEVE IT.

IN THE FALL OF 1937, WE ENTERED SCHOOL, THIS TIME AS JUNIORS. YOU CAN BE ASSURED THAT WE FELT OUR IMPORTANCE BECAUSE OF THE DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES THAT RESTED UPON OUR SHOULDERS. WHEN WE CAME BACK, WE FOUND THAT WE

HAD A NEW SUPERINTENDENT, MR. RALPH E. GASKINS, WHO ALSO PROVED TO BE A VERY ACTIVE AND EFFICIENT MAN. SEVERAL MORE MEMBERS OF OUR CLASS HAD DROPPED BY THE WAYSIDE. FAIRY HILL HAD MARRIED DURING THE SUMMER, FEELING THAT SHE COULD NO LONGER GO ON IN LIFE AS A SINGLE GIRL. A RATHER IMPORTANT EVENT (AT LEAST, WE THINK SOL) WAS THAT THE TENTH AND ELEVENTH GRADES PLAYED "HOOKEY" ON APRIL I. "APRIL FOOL'S DAY." WE HAD A CAPITAL TIME, BUT THE TEACHERS HAD THE IR DAY THE NEXT DAY, MUCH TO OUR CHAGRIN. THE OUT-STANDING FEATURE OF THE YEAR WAS THE JUNIOR-SENIOR RECEPTION. WE STROVE TO MAKE IT A SUCCESS AND GIVE THE DEPARTING SEN-TORS A GOOD TIME. ABOUT THIS TIME, PREPARATION FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE NEW SCHOOL BUILDING AND A GYMNASIUM WAS BEGUN, AND WERE WE PROUD! WE ENDED THE SCHOOL YEAR AT THE OLD SCHOOL BUILDING, RATHER CROWDED, BUT NOT. IN. THE LEAST DISAPPOINTED BECAUSE WELVERE LOOKING FORWARD TO THE TIME WHEN WE COULD EXPAND A LITTLE.

WHEN WE ENTERED OUR SENIOR YEAR IN THE FALL OF '38 REALTZING THAT OUR HIGH SCHOOL LIVE WAS RAPIDLY DRAWING TO A CLOSE, THERE WAS, MINGLED WITH OUR JOYS ALSO A DEEP FEELING OF SADNESS. OUR CLASS HAD FINALLY DWINDLED DOWN TO THIRTEEN WHO WERE: ALSTON ACKERMAN, HILLIE ACKERMAN, JOE BEN ACKERMAN, MIRIAM ACKERMAN, PERRY ACKERMAN, REM-SON ACKERMAN, MAGGIE ADAMS, RUTH ADDISON, GLADYS BRIDGE, NORMAN DAVIS, HERBERT HILL, THOMAS-HOFF, AND JIMMIE RHODE. WE WERE STILL IN THE OLD SCHOOL BUILDING AND ALTHOUGH WE WOULD NOT HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO GO TO SCHOOL IN THE NEW BUILDING, WE WERE GLAD THAT THE OTHERS WOULD HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY TO USE IT. WE WHO LOVE COTTAGEVILLE SCHOOL KNEW WHAT THIS BUILDING WOULD MEAN TO THE ON-COMING PUPILS.

THEN CAME OUR RINGS. HOW PROUD WE WERE OF THEM AND HOW PROUDLY WE DISPLAYED THEM! ANOTHER PLEASANT EVENT WAS THE JUNIOR-SENIOR RECEPTION. WE HABBED A VERY PLEASANT AND SUCCESSFUL YEAR WITH OUR ABLE SUPERINTENDENT MR. GASKINS. AS WE LEAVE SCHOOL WE LOOK OVER OUR HIGH SCHOOL LIFE LONGINGLY AND MEMORIES OF HAPPY DAYS GREET US AND OUR HEARTS SADDEN TO THINK THAT WE ARE HAVING TO LEAVE ALL THERE. BUT THE SUN HAS SET ON OUR HIGH SCHOOL LIFE AND WE MUST GO AND WEE WHAT FATE HAS IN STORE FOR US. —JOE BEN ACKERMAN,

#### SPORTS SUMMARY.






