

Then came our rings. How proud we were of them and how proudly we displayed them! Honors during this year were given to Julia Alice Smith and Wendell Adams for most intellectual and to Vermelle Gatch for most outstanding in music.

Crawford Ackerman left us to join the United States Army. He is stationed in Korea. Seniors! Our class had dwindled down to fourteen. We had finally reached the goal of all high school students, but we had to exert ourselves even more than before. Sports! Senior Play! Senior Superlatives! Senior Privileges! Senior Honors! Holidays! Examinations! Annual! Junior-Senior! Graduation Plans! Caps! Gowns! Invitations! Etc.

We have had great happiness and great sorrows during one time or another. These will soon be memories which we will cherish the rest of our lives. By this time next year, seniors will be studying and training for positions of all kinds; many will be in the armed forces of the United States, but whatever the task, it will be met with the grim determination and sincerity which Cottageville School has given us. We have learned to do our best with what we have whether it be great or small. Our aim in the future is to carry on with what we have learned.

We hope that students of the past and future remember the motto, "Education Is A Possession Of Which Man Cannot Be Robbed."
