



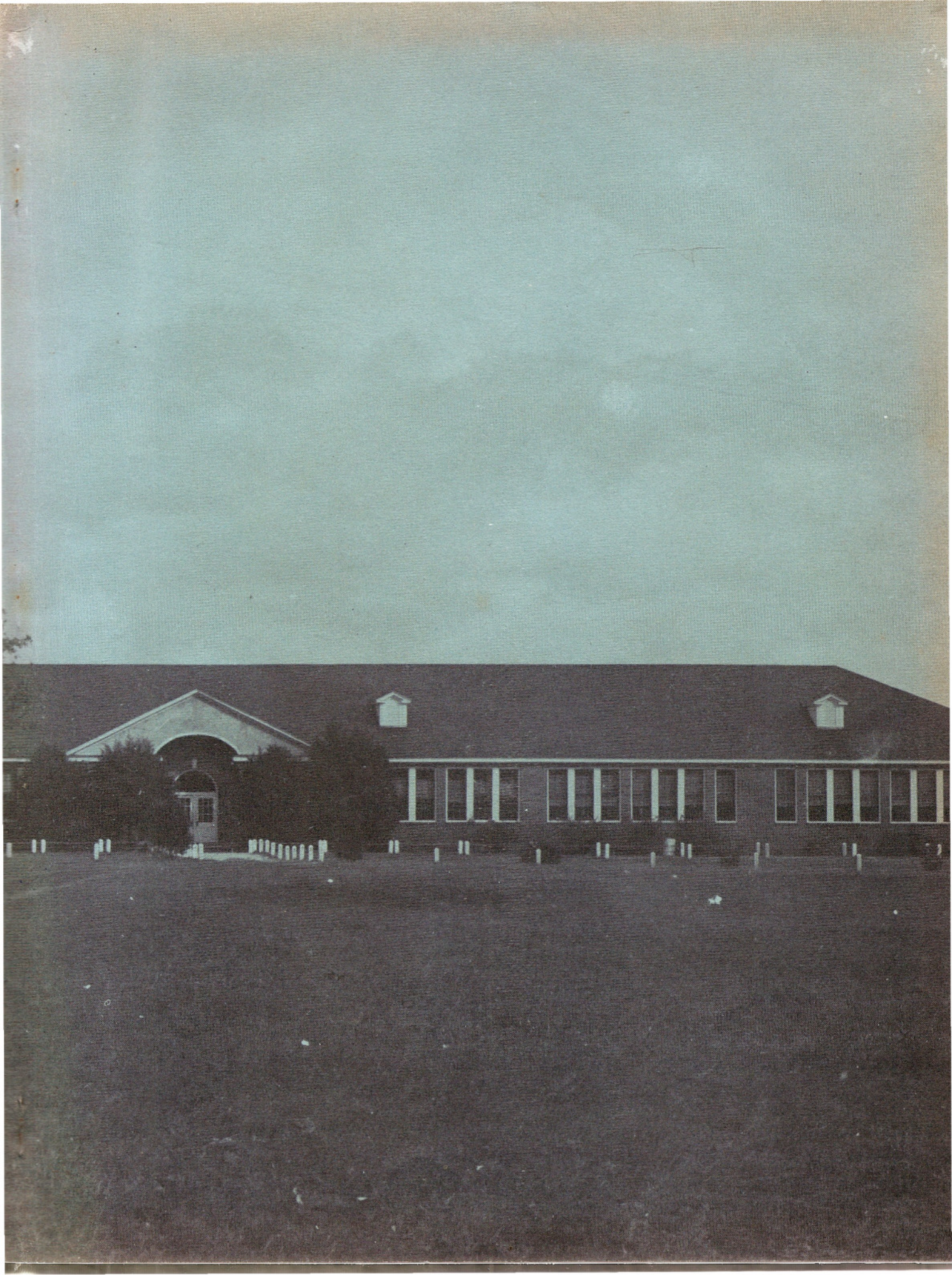

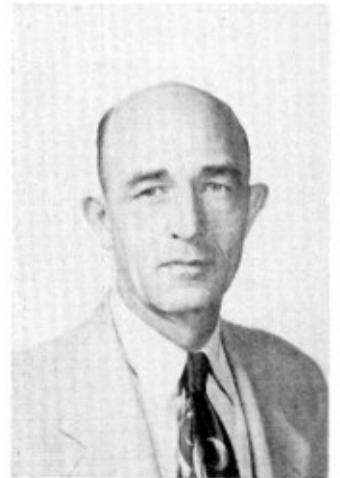
## Foreword

We shall try to face our duties with a smile.

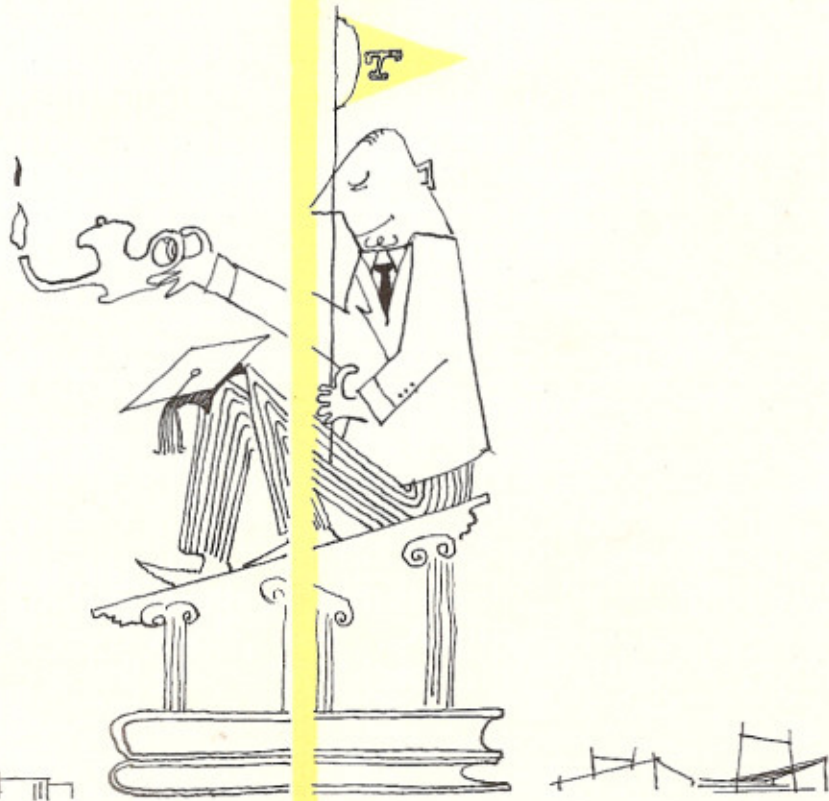
