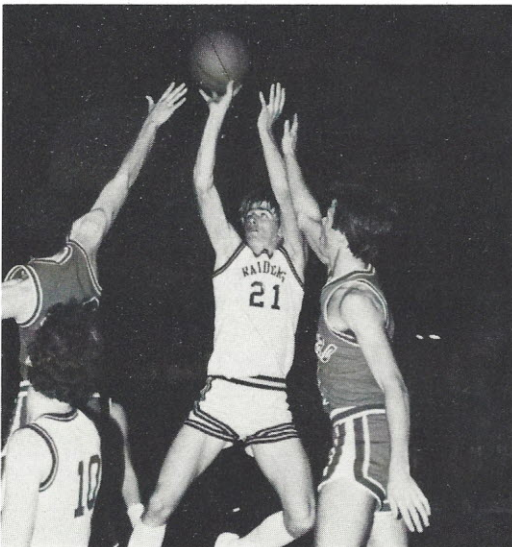
Boys Basketball
