

Changes In . . .

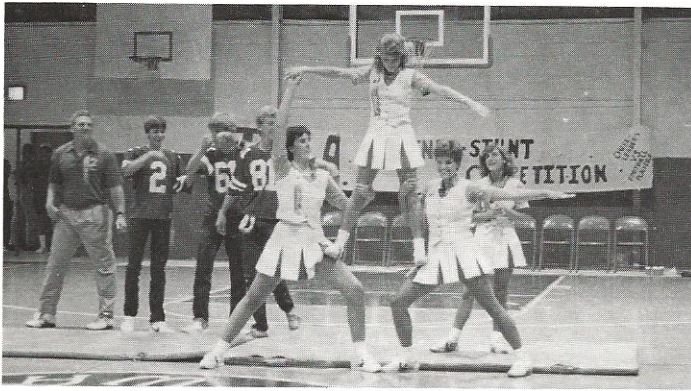
School spirit is one of the most important things in any school. This is not just cheering at the game, wearing spirit ribbons, or being on the team. School spirit is the pride that a student has in his school.

This year, this pride could be seen all over the campus of J.C.C.A. As the students walked down the halls, friendly smiles were always

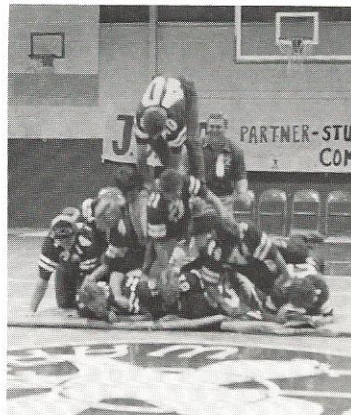
