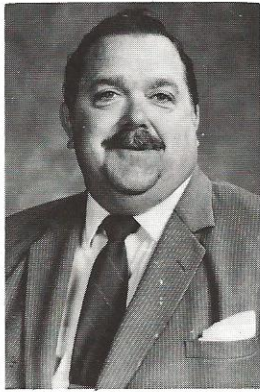


Robert Bennett — Headmaster, 9th grade Physical Science
