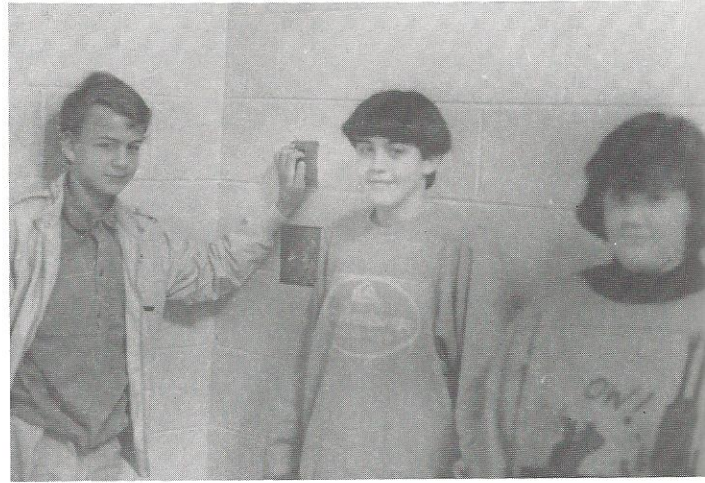
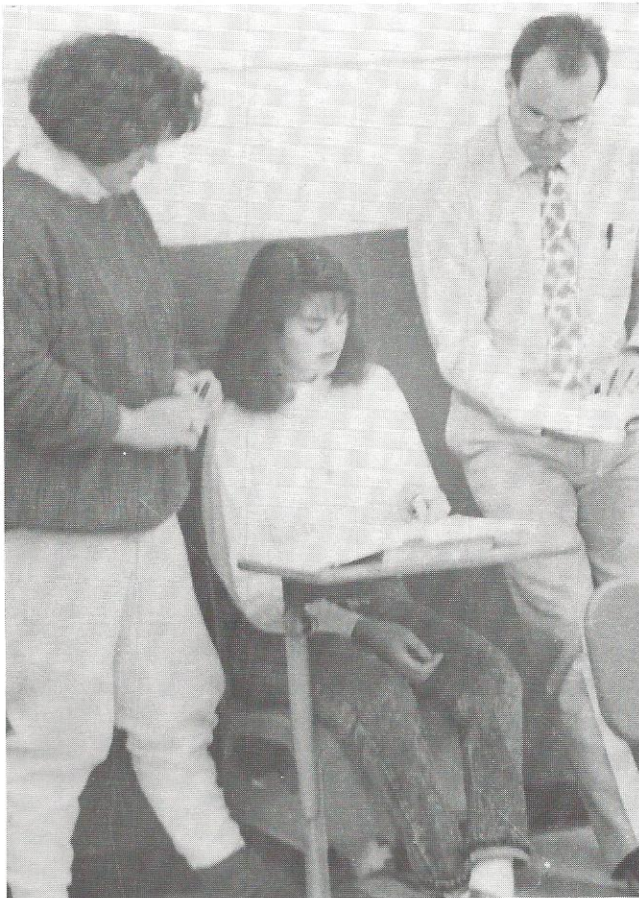
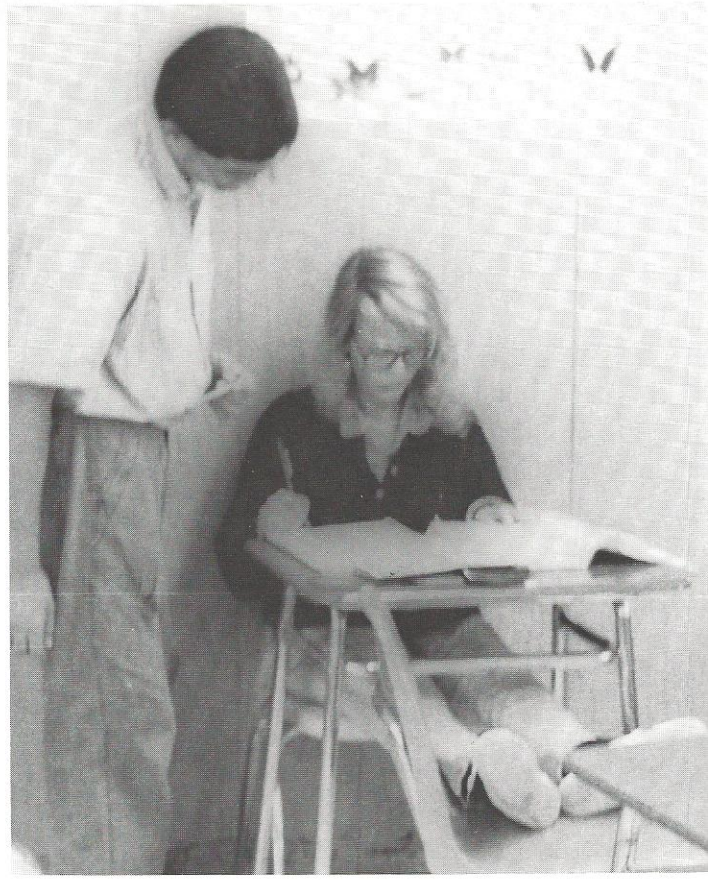


Heather Gahagan and Umesh Patel realize that chemistry is an important part of the SAT. In Mrs. Griffith's class they both work on chemical formulas.
