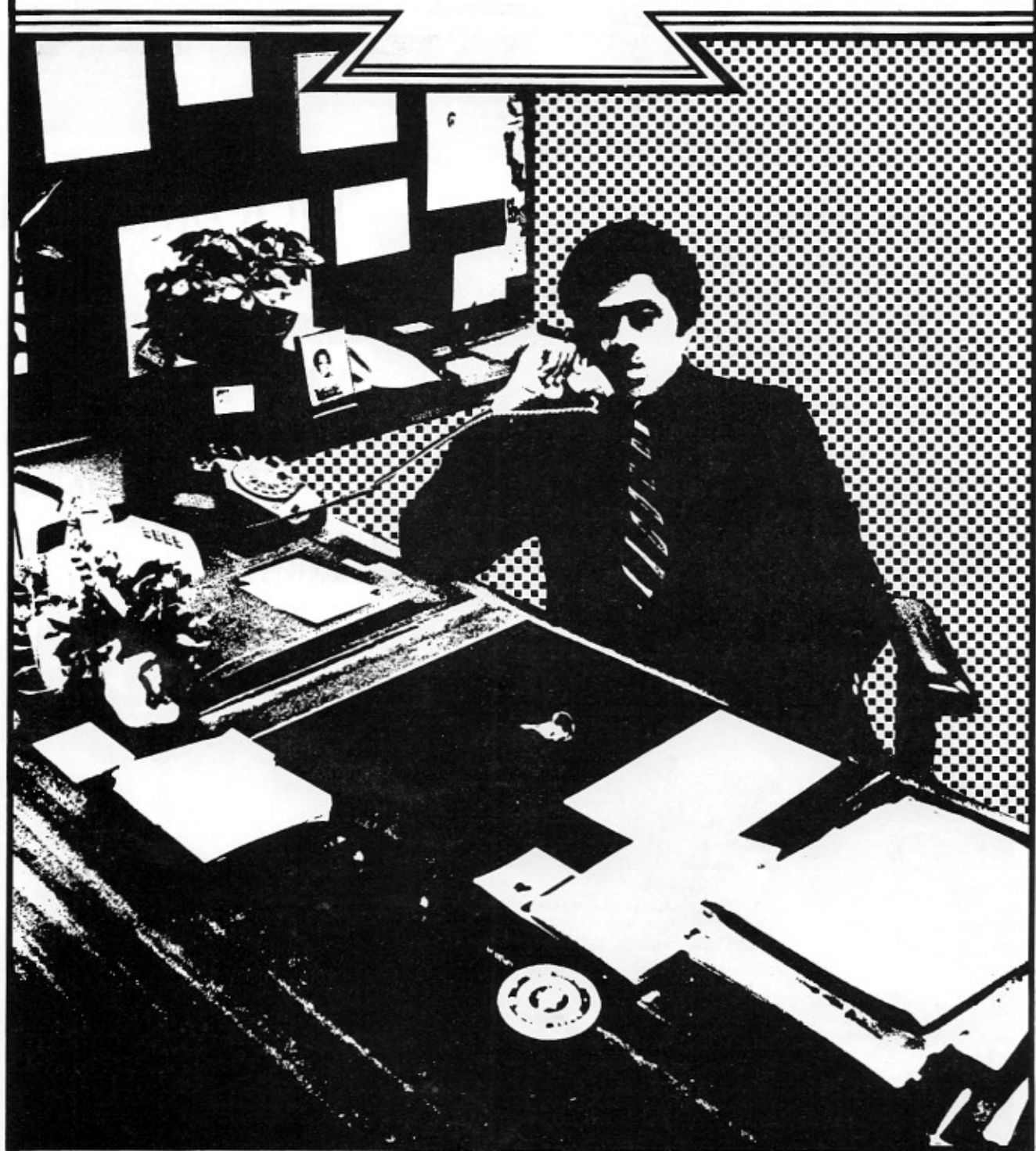
For her efforts at Ruffin High School, Heritage 1979-80 is dedicated to Mrs. C. Hudson.
