





#### Foreword

On September 7, 1937 twelve hundred lucky students entered the halls of an unnamed building. With them came Mr. Harry H. Seidel as principal, Mr. Norman B. Dee as assistant principal, thirty-six teachers, and two clerks. These were the pioneers who would choose the name Southwest for their high school, green and gold as their school colors, "Enter to learn; go forth to serve" as the school motto. They would set the high scholastic standards and establish the many traditions which today we cherish.

Time passes quickly. Southwest, originally built as an academic high school, now is building an addition for its flourishing practical arts activities. Driver Training, Home Care of the Sick, Psychology, American Problems, Radio Workshop, and Publications are among the newer subjects which have broadened our curriculum.

Time, too, has changed the personnel of the school. Of the thirty-six original faculty members only twelve remain of a faculty that now has sixty-nine persons. Two principals have come and gone since the days of Mr. Seidel. Mr. Young, one of the original faculty members, now occupies the principal's chair. To help him are two assistant principals, four clerks, four counselors, and an outstanding *Student Council*. Today the student body has 1559 eager boys and girls, who find it indeed difficult to choose from the enriched program now offered at the school.

Extra-curricular activities have added additional interests throughout the years. Many clubs have come and gone. Our classical ones, however, have stood the test of time. Latin, Spanish, French, and German clubs have always been very popular at Southwest. Service clubs, too, have grown with the years. We now have, besides the original Special Service, a Receptionist club, a Duplicating Service group, a Projection club, and a Junior Red Cross unit. Also Southwest has had its share of success in the sports field. Over 200 girls now enjoy the G.A.A. In interscholastic sports our boys have had many championship teams. Baseball leads with five; tennis has had four; football, two; and golf, one. In our music department our band, which has been in existence since the early days of Southwest, has done a great deal of community work. Beginning with twenty-four musicians, it now numbers eighty-five members. Our choir, too, has given much time to extra-curricular singing. As the high light of their endeavors the instrumental and vocal groups have combined to present a series of excellent operettas throughout eighteen of the school's twenty years. They have also presented many enjoyable spring concerts.

Although Southwest has grown and changed in many ways since that memorable day in September twenty years ago, two characteristics have remained the same through all the years, i. e., high scholastic attainment and the spirit and enthusiasm of those who have sojourned here.

In this Roundup we will attempt to show the progress and changes which have come with the passing years.




RAY SHEPHERD President from September, 1956 to January, 1957






#### "B" Football



# Varsity Basketball





The group meets every Thursday. It is under the sponsorship of Miss McNamara and Mrs. Whitehouse, who both give their time and effort to make the club the success it is today.


### French Club

In 1940 the name was changed to The Forum. The membership was open to Latin 3 students or higher. The offices were the same, candidati for which were elected in accordance with the provisions of the constitution. A high light of this year was the play Nil Umquam Ruri Accidit presented by students of Latin of Hanley Junior High School.







# The Roundup



The first Roundup was published in 1938 and was a small paper backed book, known as a "souvenier edition." Mr. Samuel Rosenkranz was the first sponsor. Of the sixteen yearbooks that have been sent for evaluation, five have received first place awards, three from the Columbia Scholastic Press Association and two from the Missouri National Press Association. The Roundup has also received ten second place awards and one third place award. We hope this enumeration doesn't sound boastful, but we are very proud of this record and hope our book this year will be as good as those which have gone before.

Unlike the other clubs the Clef and Quaver Club has been in existence for only four years. It was organized to stimulate interest in music and to provide an opportunity for the members of the vocal and instrumental groups to become acquainted with one another. Eligibility for membership is a music letter in one of the seven groups—Band, Orchestra, Advanced Chorus, Junior Girls Glee, Girls Glee, Boys Glee, and A Cappella Choir. To earn this music letter a student must have participated in all the main activities such as the operettas and spring festivals and have belonged to a music group for four semesters. Today this club boasts forty proud members.

. The Southwest Band has long been a source of pride to Southwest High Schoool. As we turn back to the 1938 Round-up, we discover that the band was among those first music organizations at Southwest.

This first band consisted of twenty-four musicians, who met daily the seventh period in room 413 under the direction of Maestro Monachesi. Today, twenty years later, its enrollment is over three times its original number. Slightly over a year later the direction of both clubs was taken over by Miss Meyer. The World War claimed Miss Meyer's services and Miss Thym substituted for the "duration." Then, war being over, "Major" Meyer returned and has directed their activities ever since.

Through the years the members of these two clubs have been busy doing their part in providing school entertainment. Year after year we have all enjoyed their fine performances in operettas, Christmas programs, and spring festivals. Besides these annual activities there have often been occasions for these groups to make appearances in special aud sessions.

Junior Girls Glee is the baby of all of Southwest's fine music groups. This ensemble, which was born in the spring of 1955, was formed primarily to prepare its members, many of whom are freshmen and sophomores, for membership in the more advanced choral groups. It was not long before this new organization caught the active spirit of the other music groups. We find the club joining with the other choral groups in our operetta, Christmas program, and spring festival. In spite of its short existence, we are proud to say that the Junior Girls Glee Club has certainly taken its place in the music family of Southwest High School.

All three of these groups have kept up on the social end of the line as well as the musical. Besides taking part in the department's social activities, they have also had a number of their own, which included "pizza" parties, and hayrides.





# A Cappella Choir

Southwest's leading vocal chorus, the A Cappella Choir, started when the doors of the school were opened. There were forty-six members in that first choir. That year they participated in the Washington University Music Festival. The first sponsor, Miss Elsie Press, soon left and was replaced by Miss Leontone Meyer. When World War II broke out, Miss Meyer, who was a marine officer, had to leave Southwest. From 1944 to 1946 Miss Thym was the director. After the war Major Meyer came back to Southwest, where she has been vocal director ever since.

Today eighty-three songsters belong to the choir.

These song birds could also be called social butterflies. They, with other music groups, had a party at St. Mark's Episcopal Church. In April they joined with the Boys Glee Club in giving a hayride at Valley Mount.

The serious life of the choir is shown by the calendar on the opposite page. We would like to call your attention to the number of community services that have been rendered. Besides these, during the year this chorus has provided pleasant entertainment for school affairs. Surely the choir has shown its leadership since the opening of Southwest and will continue to be the leader of all vocal groups there.



Other interesting characters in this unusually


