The 1958 SW track squad, under the capable direction of coaches Merchant and Beezley, captured half of its dual meets and made a good showing at the Relay Carnival as well as placing 5th in the annual Track and Field Day Meet.

In dual competition, the thinclads triumphed over three out of four of their Public High League rivals, but dropped both of their encounters with non-league opponents.

The Relay Carnival found Gleason, Green, Simmons and Cook nailing down second place in the shot-put while Hess, Graves, Dick Shimamoto and Dave Shimamoto took second in the pole vault division.

On Field Day, the senior division placed Gleason 4th in the shot and Graves 5th in the pole vault. The mile relay team of Frimel, Parentin, Keller, and Popowchak came from behind to take 5th in their event.

However, it was the Junior Division which produced the highest scores. Twelve different juniors placed in six different events to total 18½ points.

Senior Captain Jerry Gleason and Junior Captain Jerry Mulkey observed that the 1958 season was notable for its lack of hurdling or distance running talent, but was encouraging because of the development of so many outstanding Junior Cinder-men.
