The 1958 Southwest varsity football team, although failing in its bid for the P.H.L. championship, had a very successful season in that it set several new league records. Finishing competition in second place behind champion McKinley, the Kennymen established a mark of 13 consecutive league victories and extended to 12 the number of consecutive league games in which they were unscored upon.

Here is a game-by-game summary of football action for the season:

SW 7—Roosevelt 13

In a non-league game at the Roosevelt field, the Longhorns dropped their season opener to the Rough Riders. This loss broke a string of 9 wins started by a defeat of Roosevelt one year earlier. Ron Stanley scored for SW late in the 4th quarter and Dick Strader added the extra point on a pass from Mike Wofford.

SW 32—Central 0

SW extended both of its league streaks as it shut out the Central Red Wings in the P.H.L. opener. Bruce Geiger broke into the scoring column in the first quarter with a 62 yard run. Stanley scored twice, Wofford sneaked for six points and converged with Strader on pass plays good for a TD and two extra points in other offensive action.

Varsity

SW 47—Beaumont 0

Geiger and Tom Carney scored two touchdowns each in this one-sided romp. Strader went over on a 36 yard pass play from Wofford and Bill Grana crashed through from the 3 yard line. The stalwart line refused to budge against the Bluejacket drives and tackle Jerry Gleason gained the limelight with a 65 yard scoring recovery of a Beaumont fumble.

SW 6—Cleveland 0

After playing the Flying Dutchmen to a first-half scoreless tie, the Steers got the one TD they needed in the 3rd quarter as Geiger broke loose for 27 yards to score. Otherwise, it was a defensive game, with the SW line twice halting Cleveland drives near the goal line.

SW 7—Sumner 0

In another squeaker, defensive linebacker Don Parentin capitalized on a Bulldog miscue as he recovered a blocked kick and hit paydirt in the first quarter for SW's only score.
