Main Entrance to Southwest High School

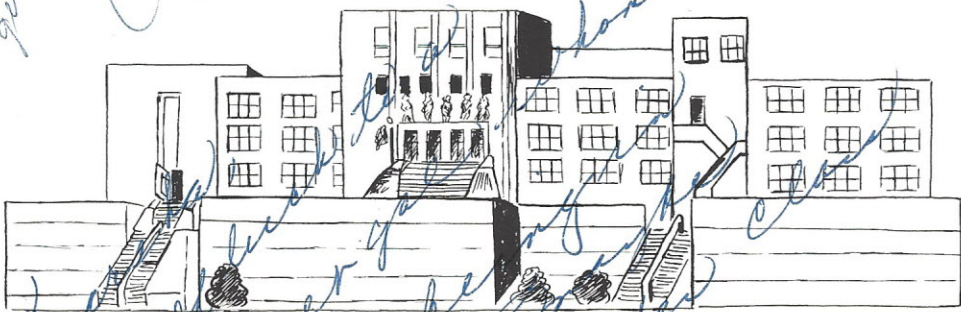

tion to the customary gifts to teachers and the parties sponsored for the June and January senior classes. Also, the P. T. A. assisted at proms and other school functions.

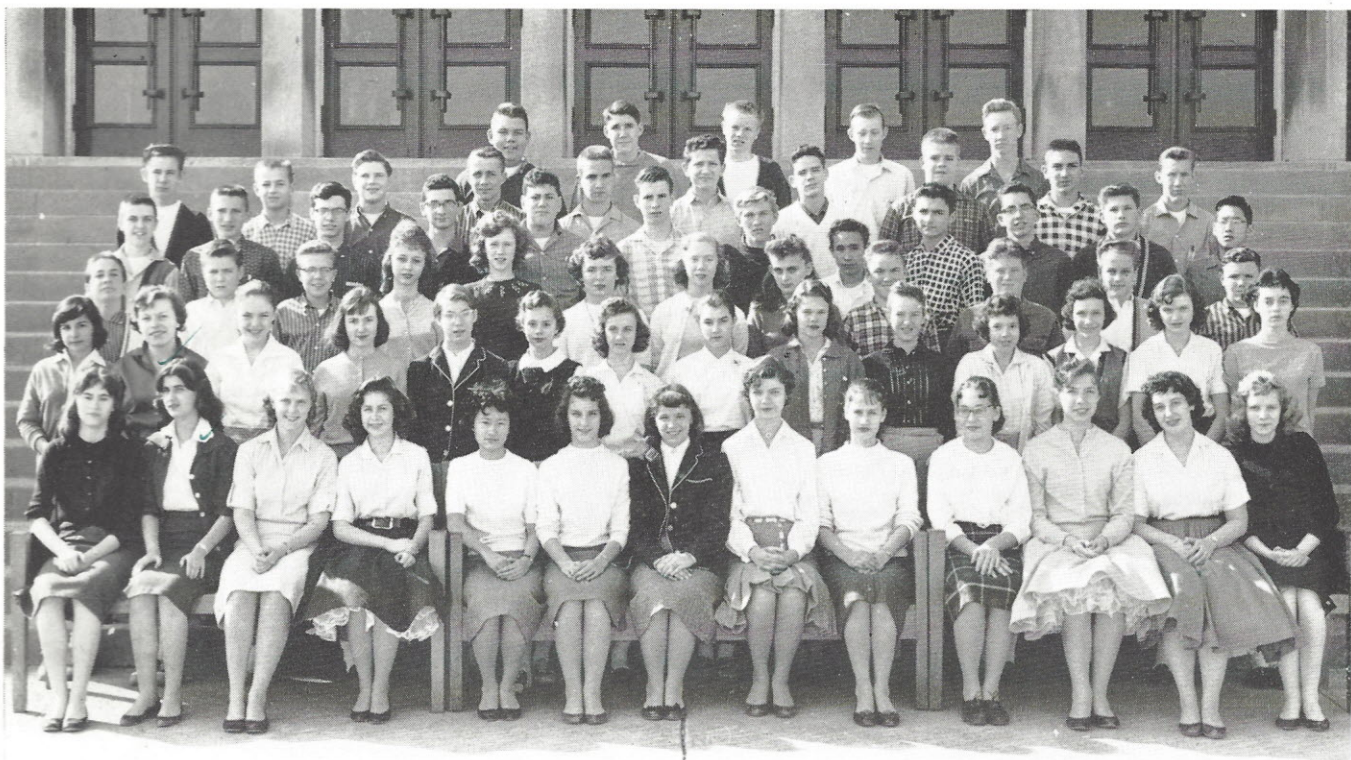

Starting the season with an inexperienced team, the SW nine displayed vast improvement as they held on to a six game league winning streak to capture second place in Public High League competition.

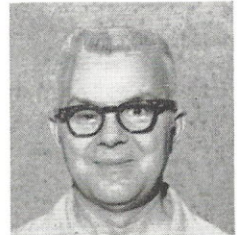
Sporting potentially the best pitching staff in the circuit, good over-all hitting, but occasionally shoddy defense, the Mac-Men showed 1958 fans the highest finish of a SW baseball team in seven years. Only one-run losses to Beaumont and Roosevelt, and a rout by State finalist Cleveland marred their league record. A non-league loss to DuBourg and another loss to Cleveland in the State Tournament completed the debit side of the ledger.

Happily, however, the varsity came out on top in all other competition. The pitching staff of Dorsam (3-1), Nelson (4-1), and Witt (1-3) combined to total the lowest earned run average in the league. Only 4 times did the opposition accumulate more than 4 runs.

Offensively, Bill Gebhart led for the second straight year with a .341 percentage. 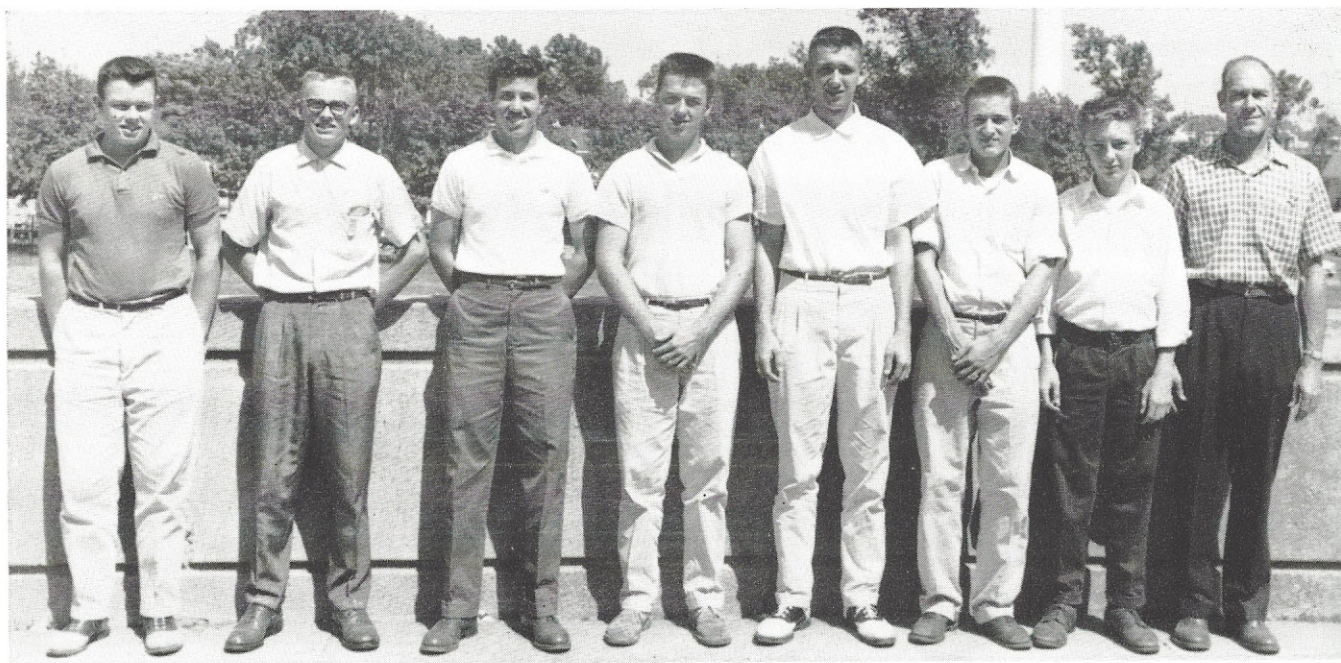


Golf Team

The 1958 Southwest varsity football team, although failing in its bid for the P.H.L. championship, had a very successful season in that it set several new league records. Finishing competition in second place behind champion McKinley, the Kennymen established a mark of 13 consecutive league victories and extended to 12 the number of consecutive league games in which they were unscored upon.

Here is a game-by-game summary of football action for the season:

SW 7—Roosevelt 13

The stalwart line refused to budge against the Bluejacket drives and tackle Jerry Gleason gained the limelight with a 65 yard scoring recovery of a Beaumont fumble.

SW 6—Cleveland 0

After playing the Flying Dutchmen to a first-half scoreless tie, the Steers got the one TD they needed in the 3rd quarter as Geiger broke loose for 27 yards to score. Otherwise, it was a defensive game, with the SW line twice halting Cleveland drives near the goal line.

SW 7—Sumner 0

In another squeaker, defensive linebacker Don Parentin capitalized on a Bulldog miscue as he recovered a blocked kick and hit paydirt in the first quarter for SW's only score.

SW 25—O'Fallon 0

The Steers snapped back to drub the O'Fallon Hornets in their next game. Carney tallied in the first and final quarters, and Geiger and Grana added 6 point touches while the line held O'Fallon's offense to a standstill.

SW 13—Hadley 33

SW suffered its first league defeat since 1956 as it dropped the season finale to Hadley's Golden Lions. Baker, Walker, Wyms, and Brown penetrated the Longhorn goal-line as the SW line cracked wide open. Geiger bowed out of competition in fine style as he scored both SW touchdowns.

Recap: Head Coach Kenny and assistant Coach Ashley masterminded the Longhorns to a top league standing. The defense was rated the best in the league, while only Hadley topped the Longhorns in offensive statistics. It is the general consensus that the boys were just "let down" for the Hadley game.

Co-captains were Rich Green and Bruce Geiger. Geiger, Green, and Jerry Gleason were elected to All Public High League teams, while Gleason made a place for himself on the mythical All-District and All-American squads. Receiving honorable mention in all-star balloting were Dick Strader, Tom Carney, and Tom Meiners.

Mr. Merchant sums up the season this way, "We did a great job at the opening of the season but we ran out of oats at the end of it. But, all in all it was a very good season."

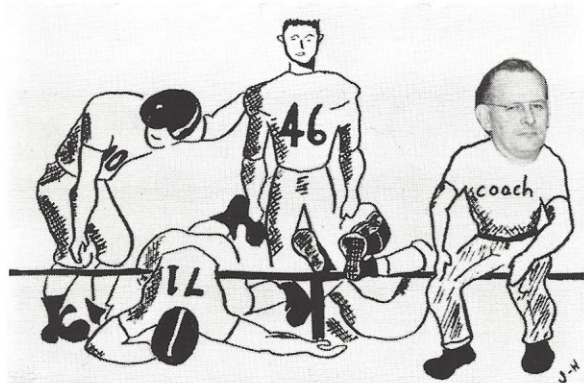

A team that has achieved such an outstanding record must be composed of equally outstanding players. This is, of course, true in the case of our own netmen.

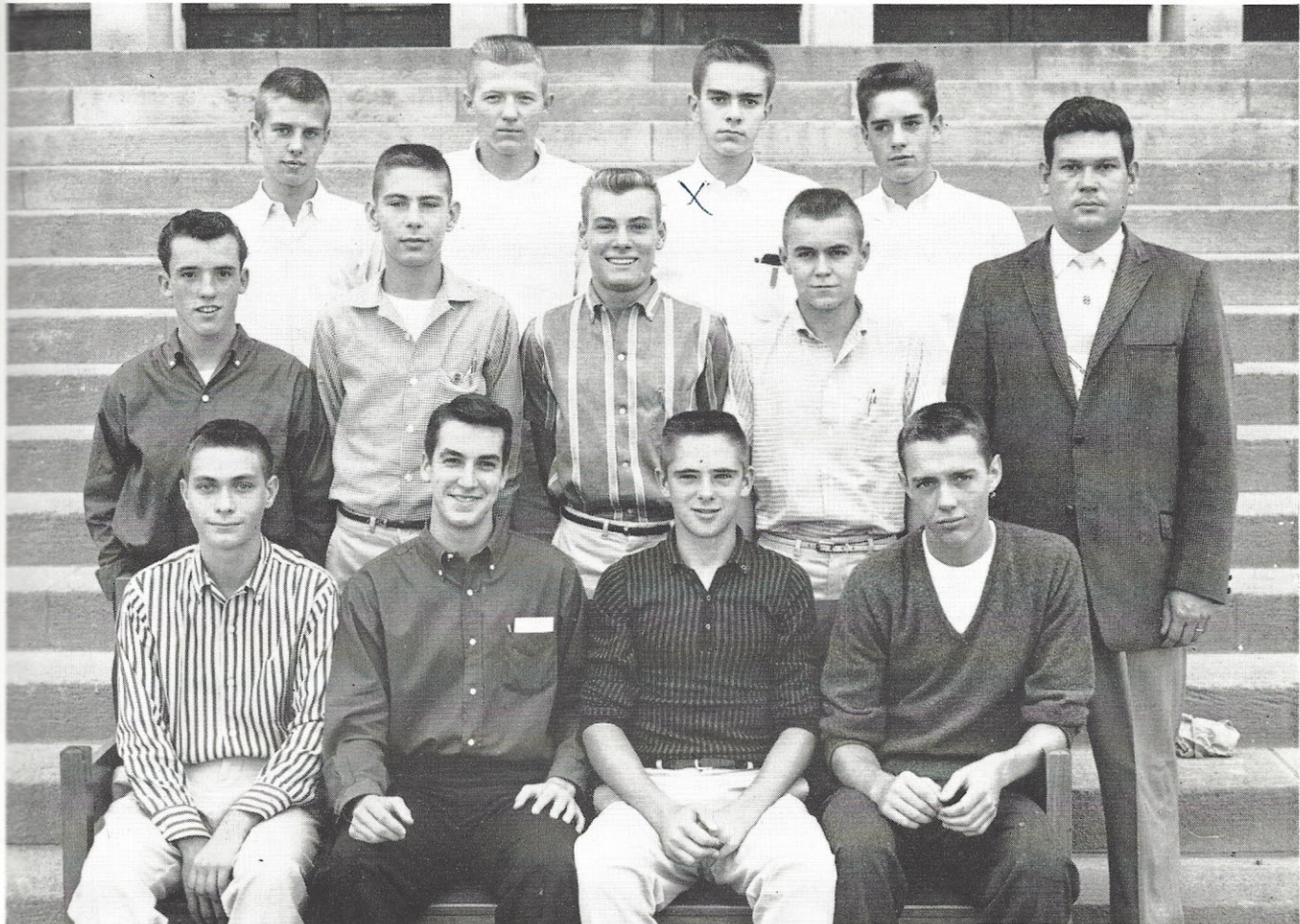

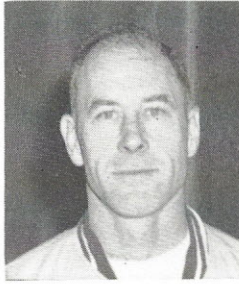


Varsity Basketball

Harris was also a defensive sparkplug, along with Bill "Moose" Luechtefeld, star center.

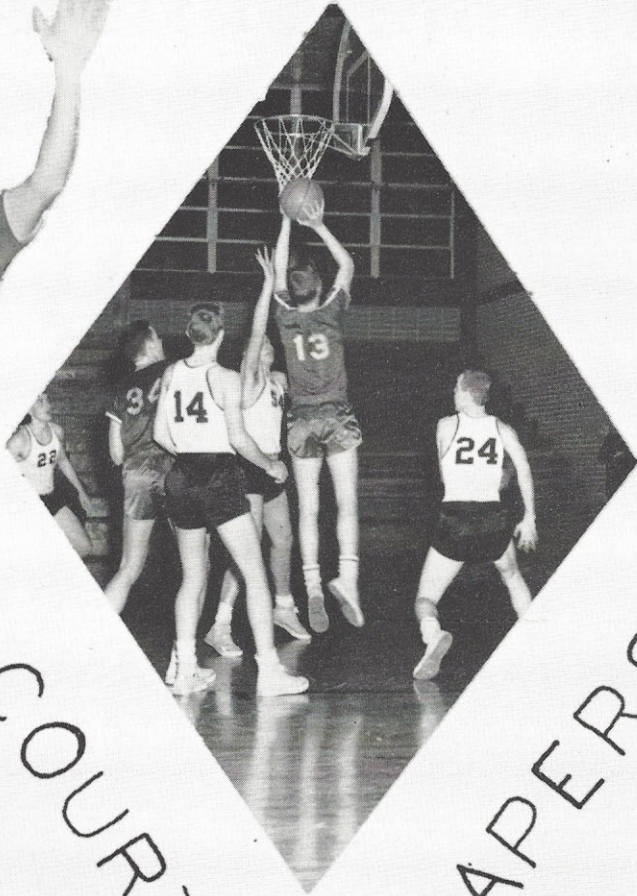
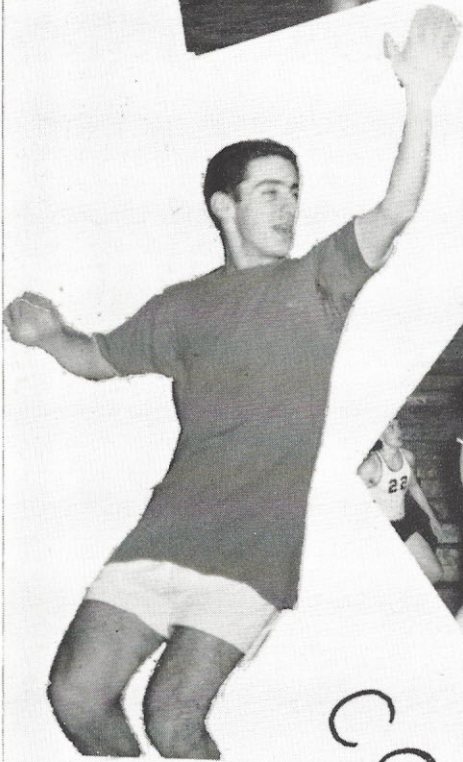
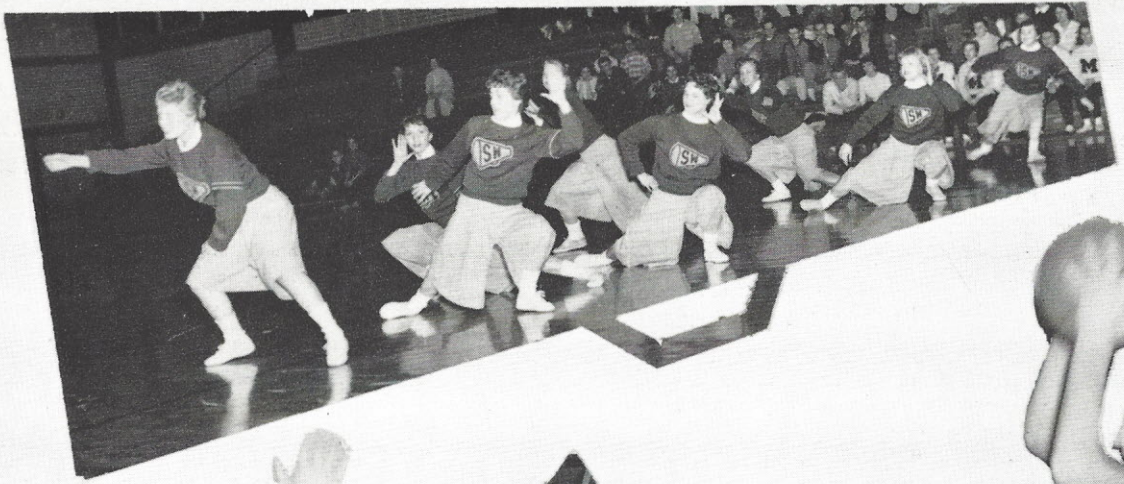
Mr. Ashley is fairly optimistic about the coming season. He says:

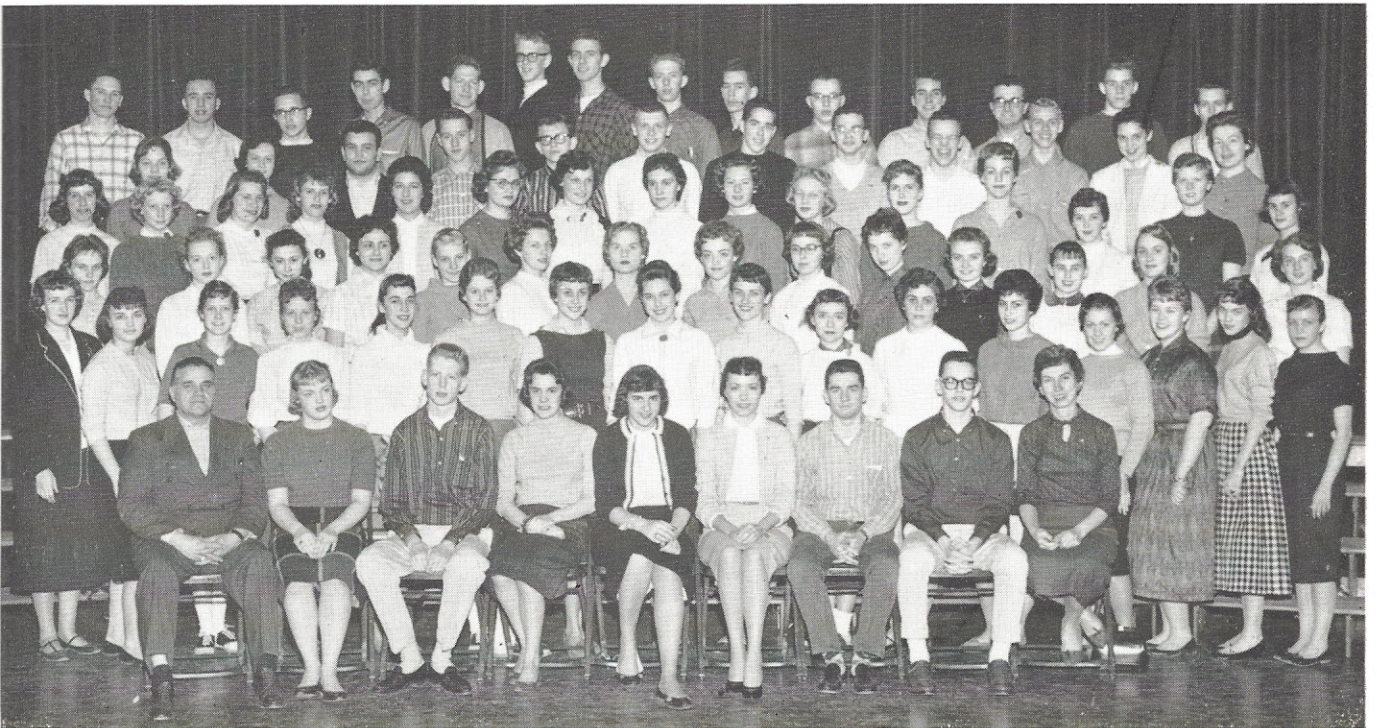
Clef and Quaver Club

Director: Miss Meyer

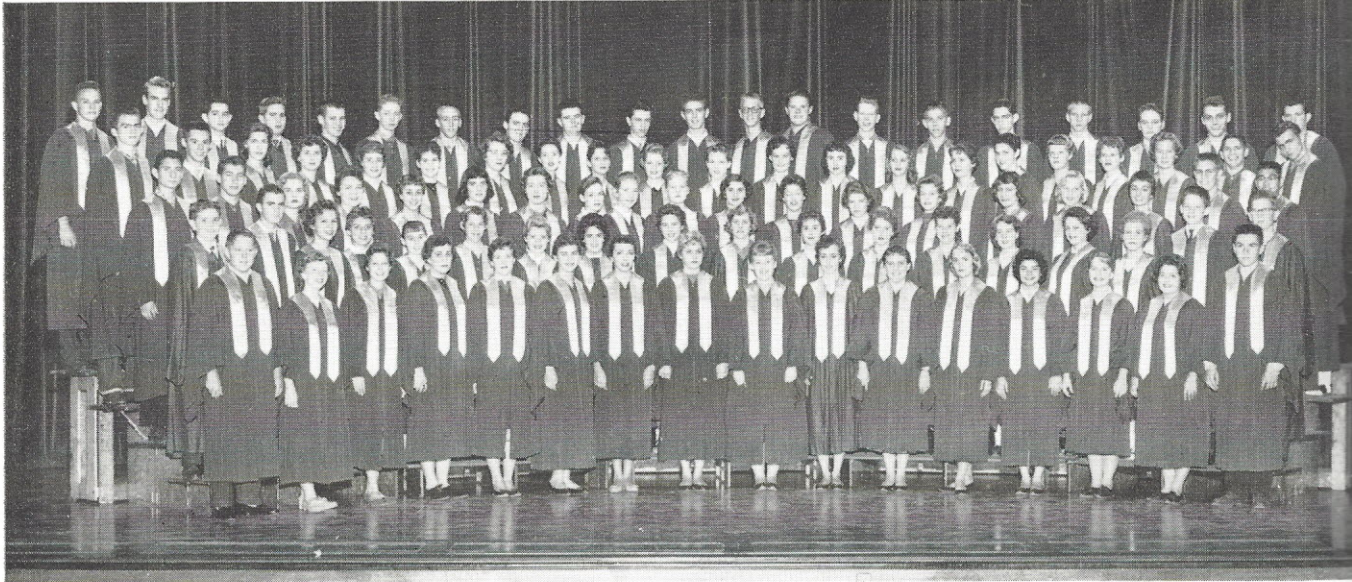

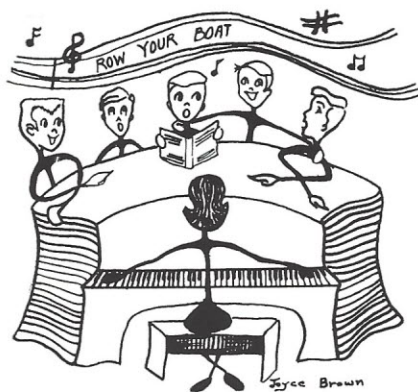
Boys' Glee

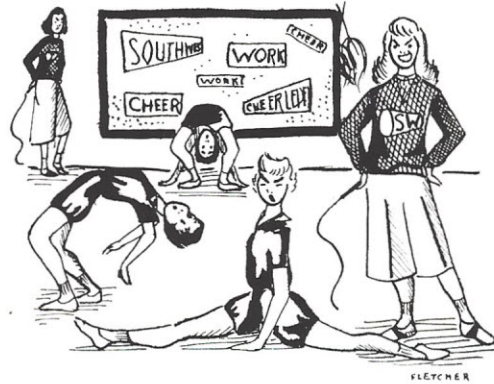
Cheerleaders Club

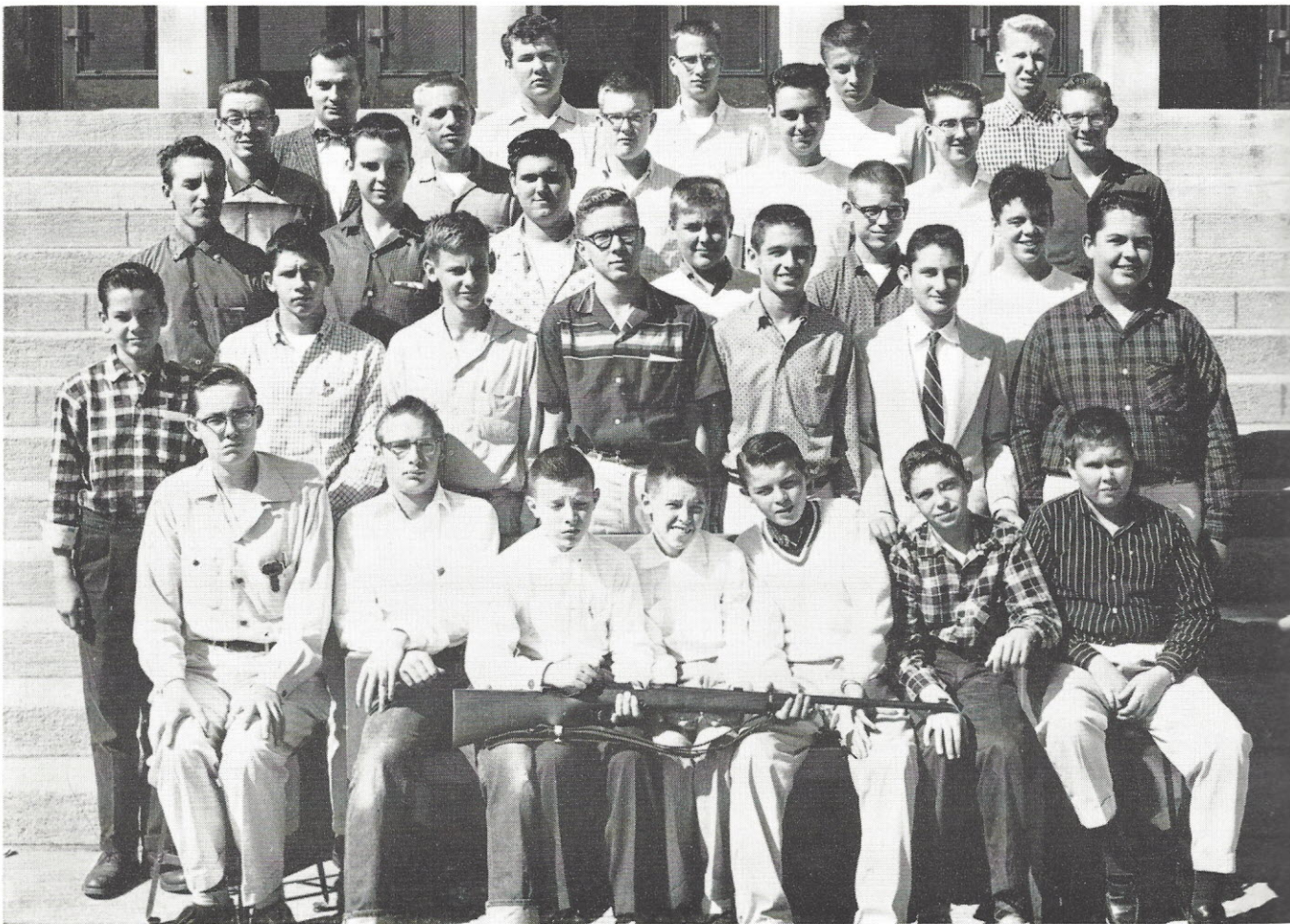
Rifle Club

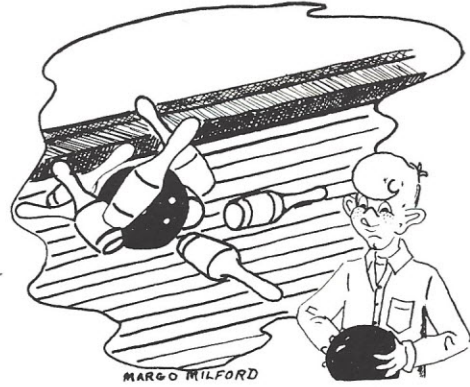
Boys' Bowling Club
