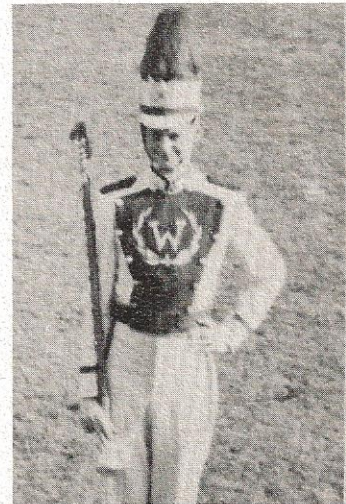
After receiving high ratings in the State Band Festival last May, the Walterboro High School Band started its 4th year with impressive performances at the football games.

The scoring was as follows for the quintet first string this season: Craven took the high scoring

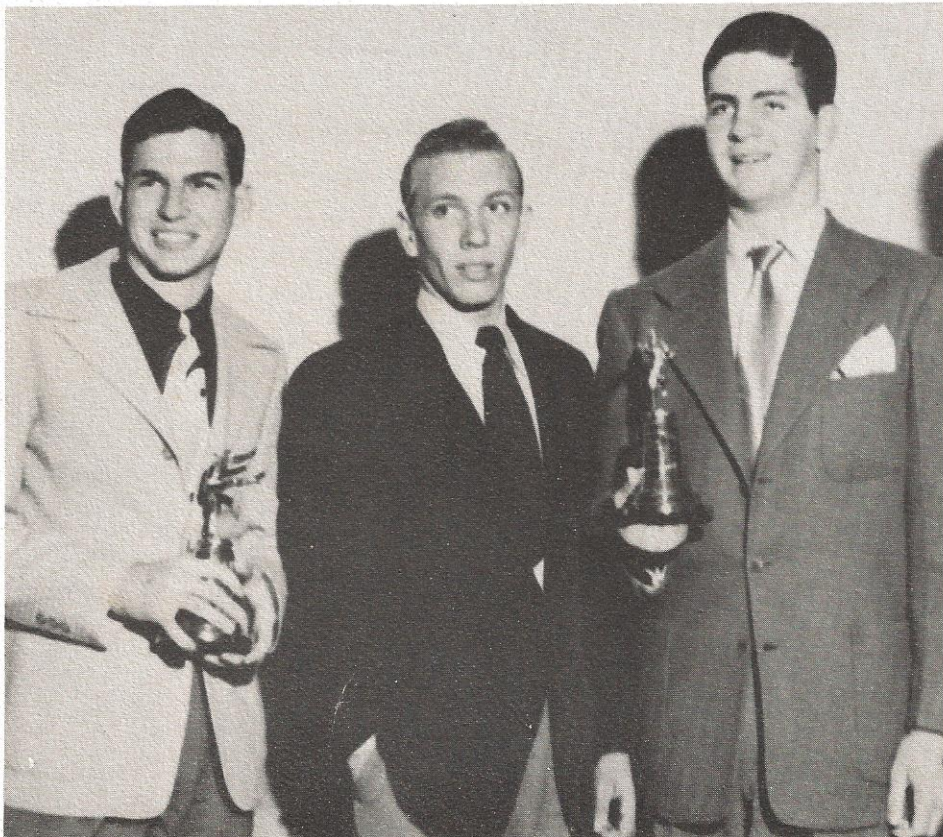
