



In the **Masonry** department, it's all right to sling a little mud because mud slinging is all a part of the job. See, mud slinging is laying the bricks and blocks. But, there are other things involved such as establishing grade lines and heights, constructing and setting in place and forms, pouring, supervising, and leveling cement mix, applying surface finishes by

grinding or use of hand wool and metal that students in masonry may also apply special coatings and repair defective concrete.
