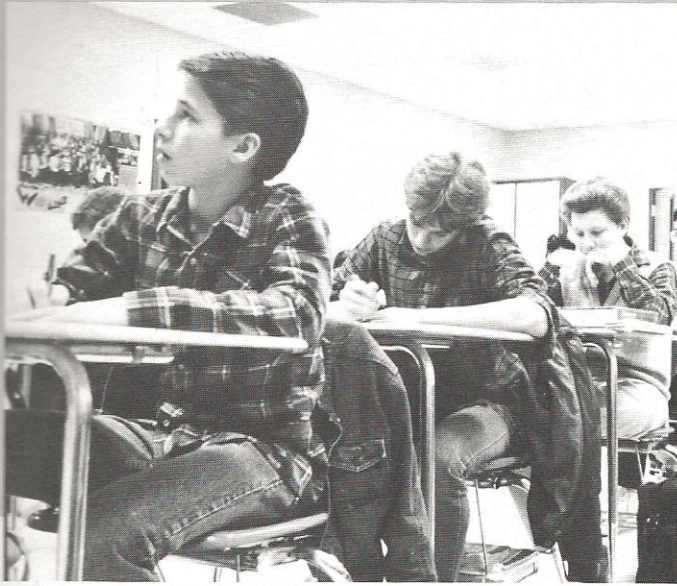


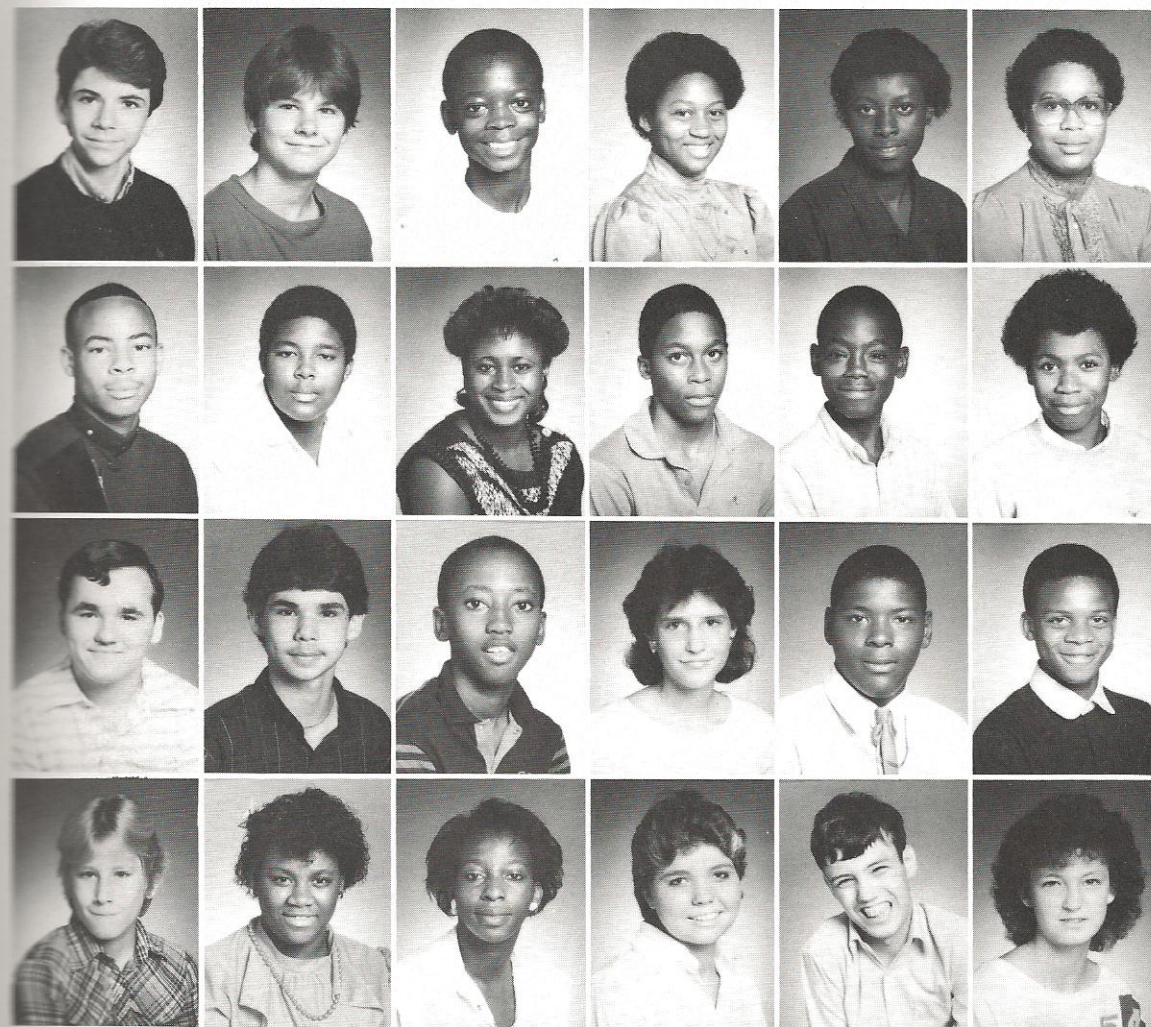
Extra Efforts Needed for Advanced Classes
