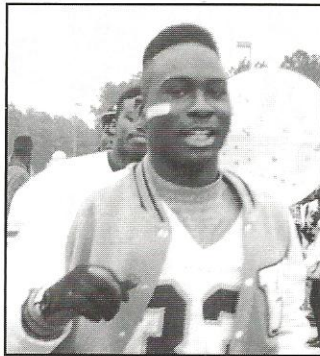




"Playing football was the largest CHANCE I took," said Senior William Moore.
