The last pep rally of the year was held before the

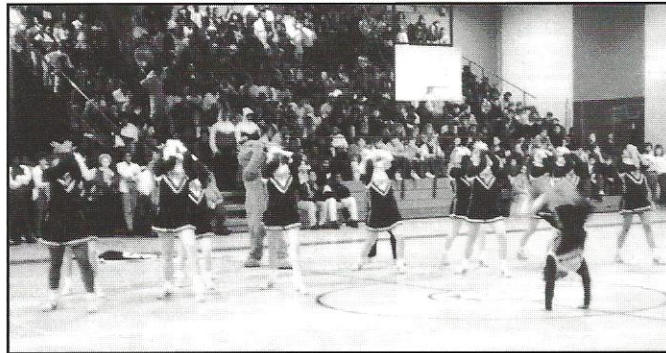
