Some students did not have the option of going out with friends on the weekends because they were active in sports.

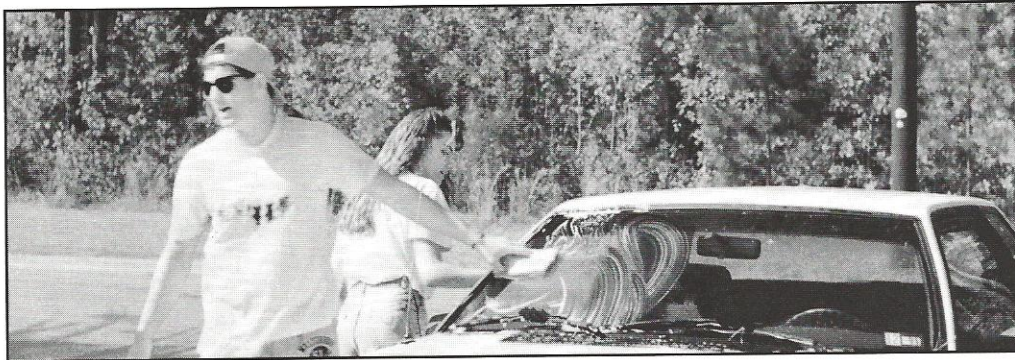
"Because being a successful tennis player takes hours upon hours of practice, one must sacrifice go-
