Miss. Sandy Stearns headed the prom commit-

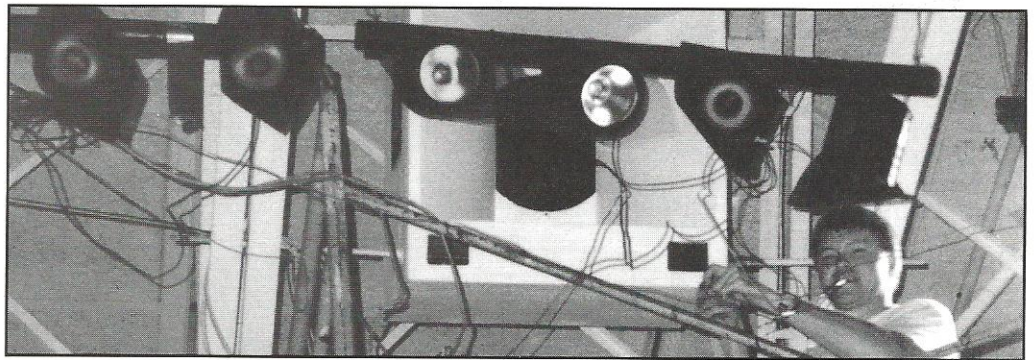

colors, neon centerpieces, and laster lights.

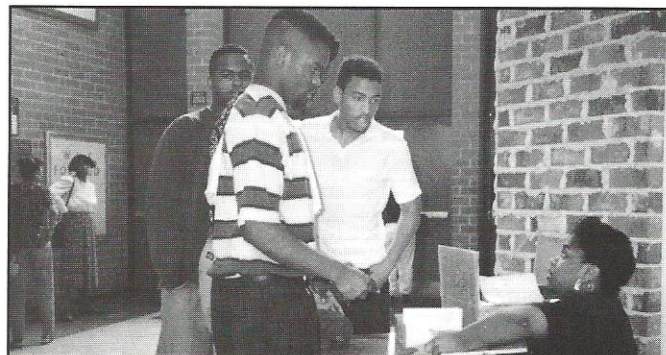
The D.J. was a little different from past years. He included fog lights and a laser light show along with the Top 40 Music. The students enjoyed the new additions.
