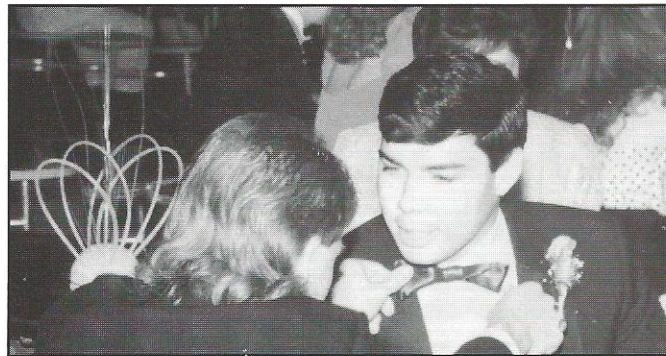
A new program was designed this year to prevent teenage drinking and driving
