dozens of cars were on the strip in search of parties. Besides teens, cops also cruised the streets. When Kids saw familiar cars at a house, they gathered there and threw a party.

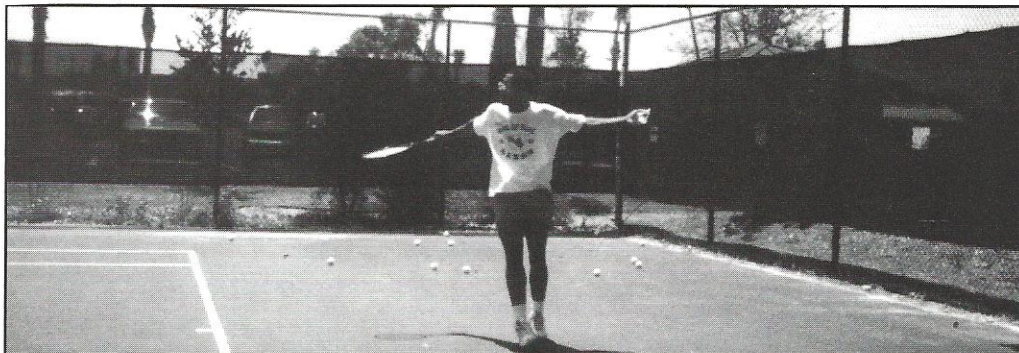

The weekend was bitter-sweet one for seniors for they knew this would be their last weekend as high school students. The saddest part was loading up and beginning the journey home.

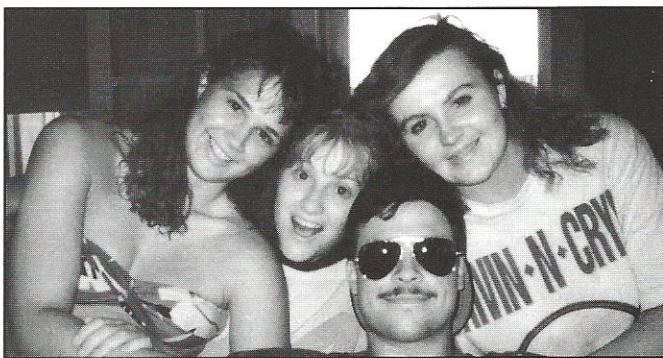
