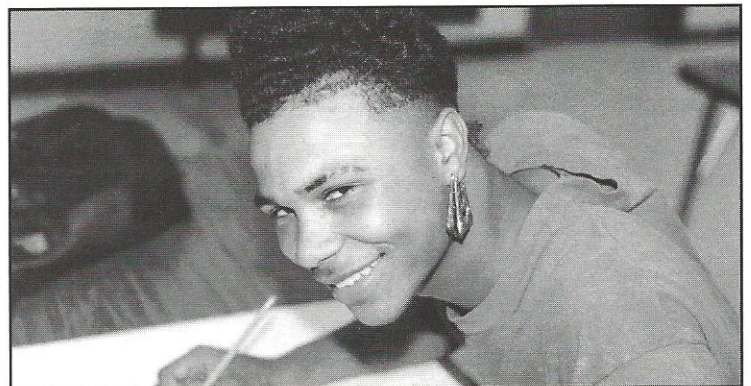
"I'm a little nervouven thought it requires time and patience, art students put forth that extra effort to minimize time in order to meet deadlines.
