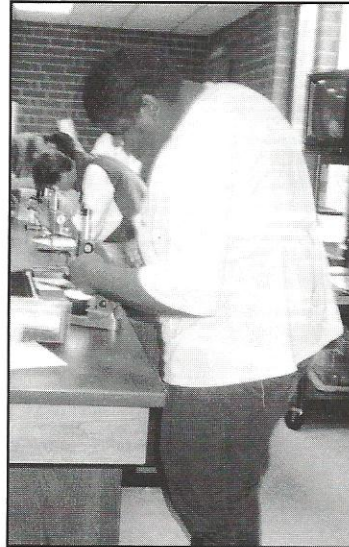


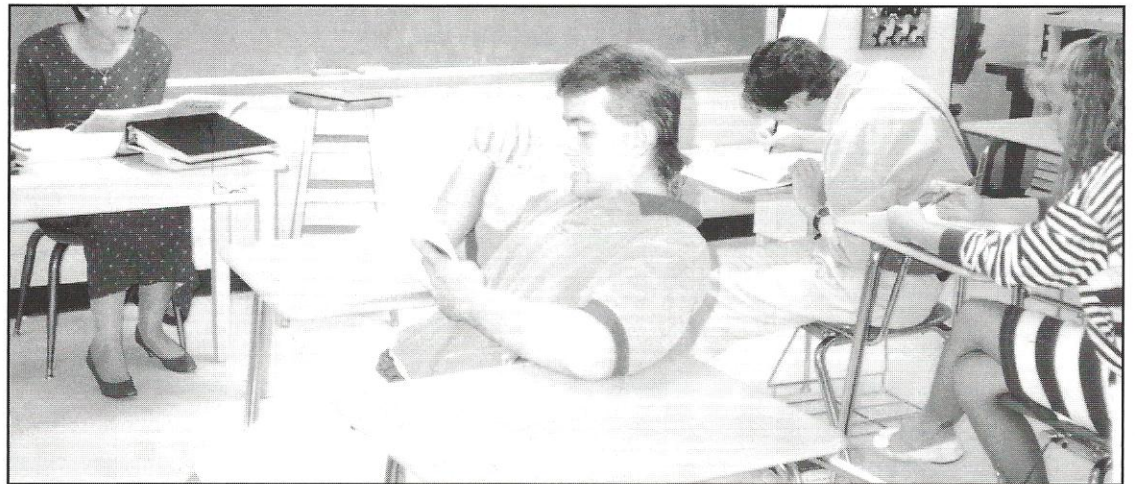


Ms. Finney-El tries to keep Dave, her pet python, from slithering away. Ms. Finney-El was the AP Biology teacher for the second consecutive year.



Senior Marvin Tucker examines the stages of mitosis through a microscope. Marvin tried for credit in three AP classes.

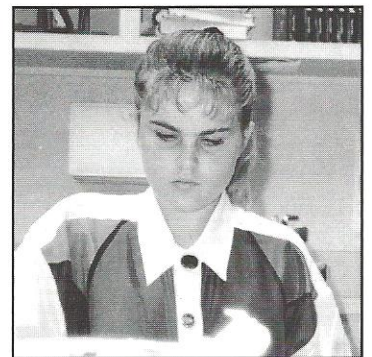
