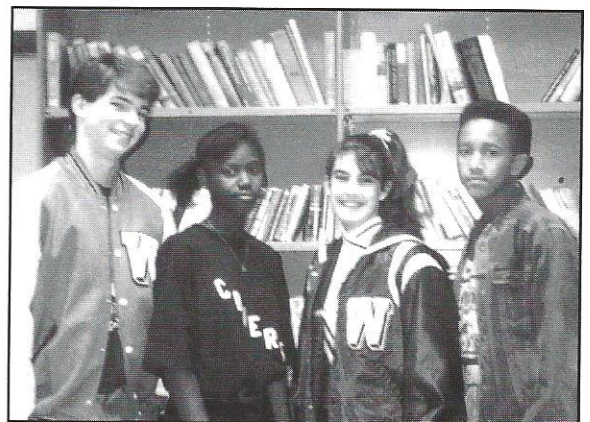
"We worked hard trying to promote school spirit. I believe Spirit Week was a success," said Shamgar.
