lie Mills, Frank Pickney, Reggie Green and Chris Brownlee.

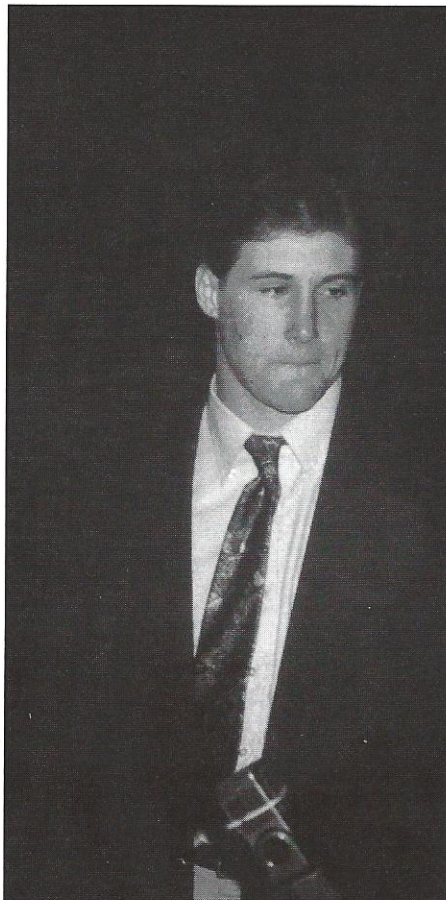
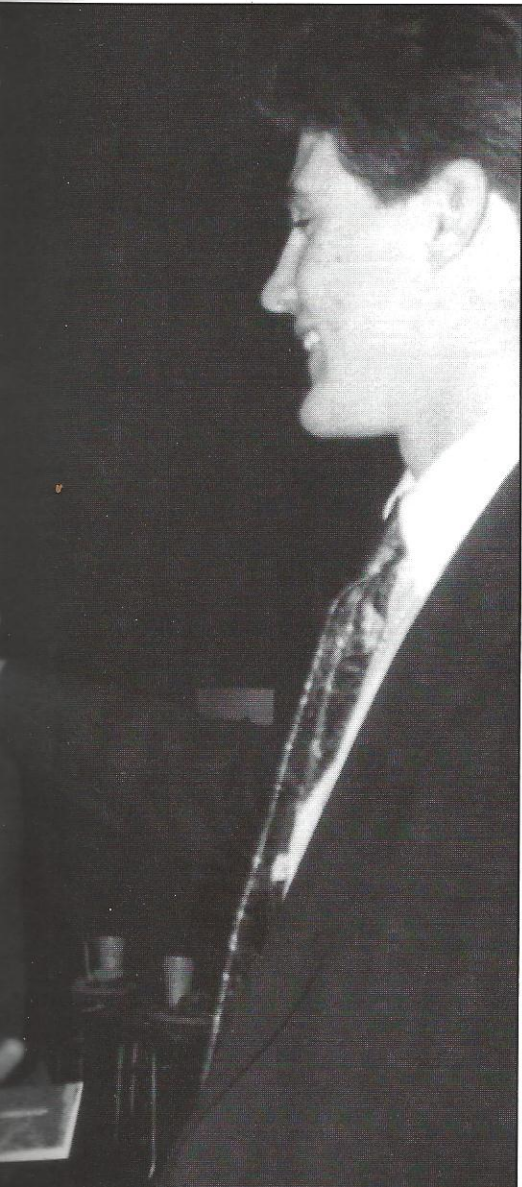
Bill Kinard, Michael Wilson and Maurice Calloway received leadership awards. Willie White and Brian Davis were freshmen who received awards.

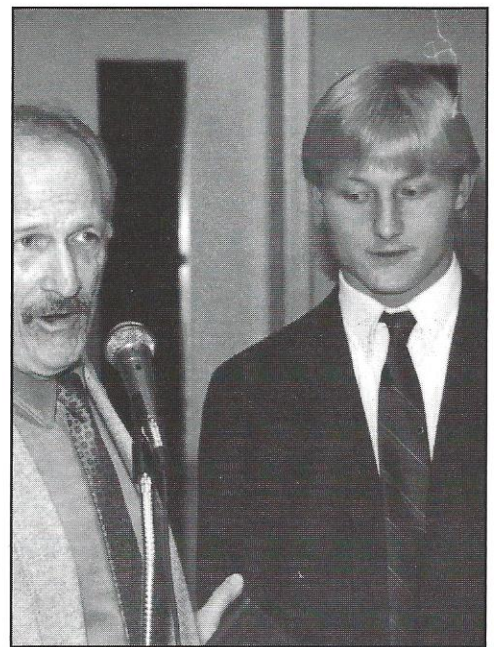
Paige Hiers received the MVP award in volleyball while Lynn Crosby was named MIP award.
