hard, and act like winners," Coach Adams said. "For the most part, they did all three."

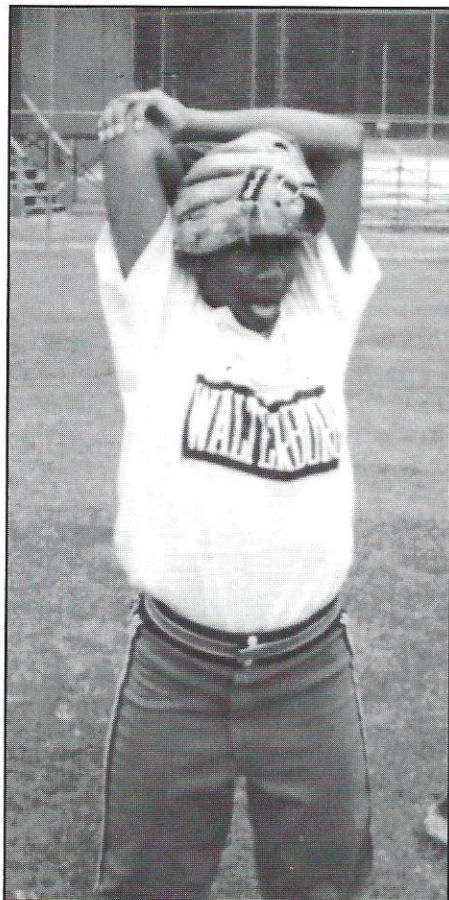
When asked if he would have changed anything, Coach Adams responded that he probably would have made an effort to hold the size of the team.

"Having so many players cut into the quality time each could receive," Coach Adams said, "and therefore, actually hurt the team."

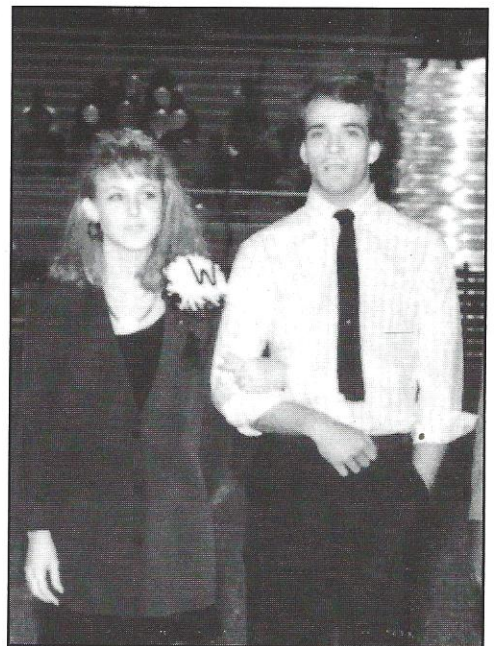
"Even though I didn't get to play that much, I was still happy to be a part of the team," said junior Lee Gibson.
