

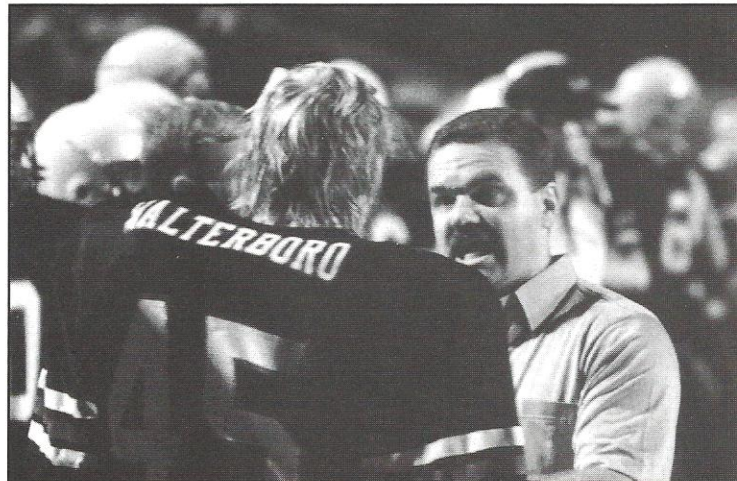
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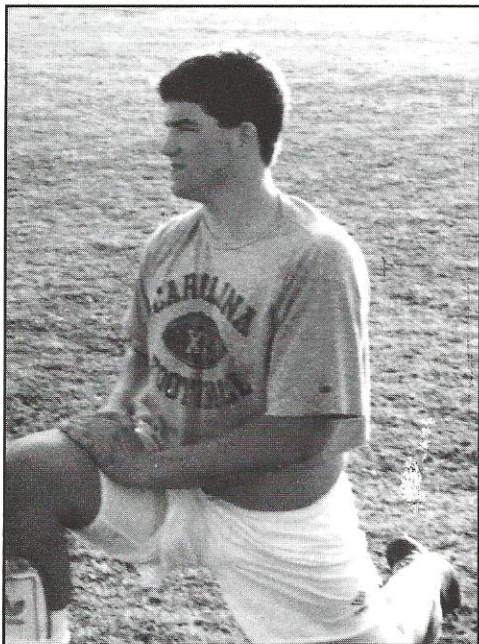

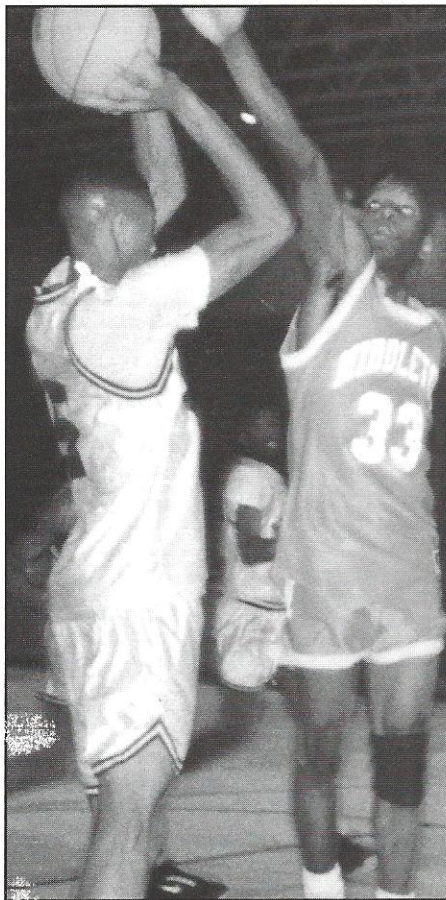


Senior Hallie Joe Mills receives advice from Coach McClendon at the Sertoma Football Classic. Hallie was the leading tackler in the state.
