From the first day of school to graduation students had fun-filled activities that made their high school years their most memorable.

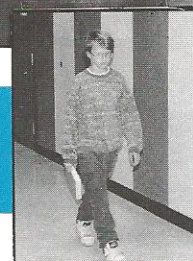
Individual fashion statements and various opinions made this generation unique. Clothes reflected different cultures. The issues that created the most interest were the environment and the economy.

Just like past generations, the present generation realized that the memory-making high school days were quickly coming to a close. They realized that this was their last chance to live it up.

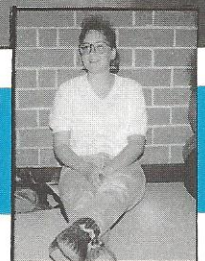
