

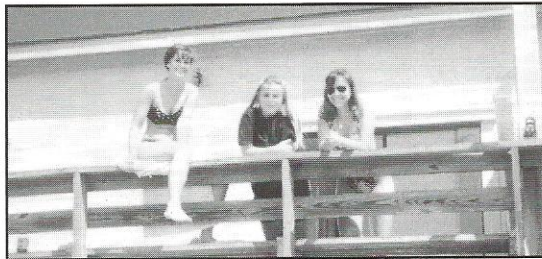
# IT WAS TIME TO PARTY
