Because she performed this musical in college, Mrs. Drawdy decided "The Pirates of Penzance" would be an exciting

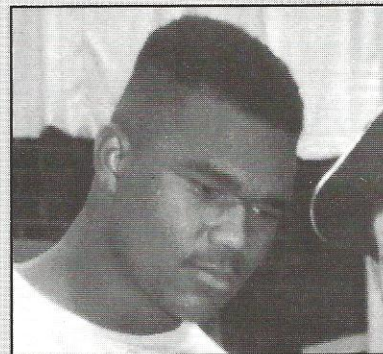
