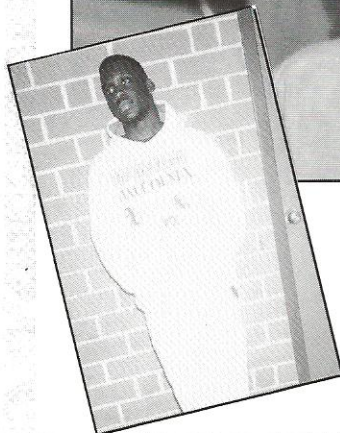
"I enjoy making my friends laugh," said Kelly. "I think that if I were not in a good mood, I would want someone to cheer me up."
