

# Two of a Kind

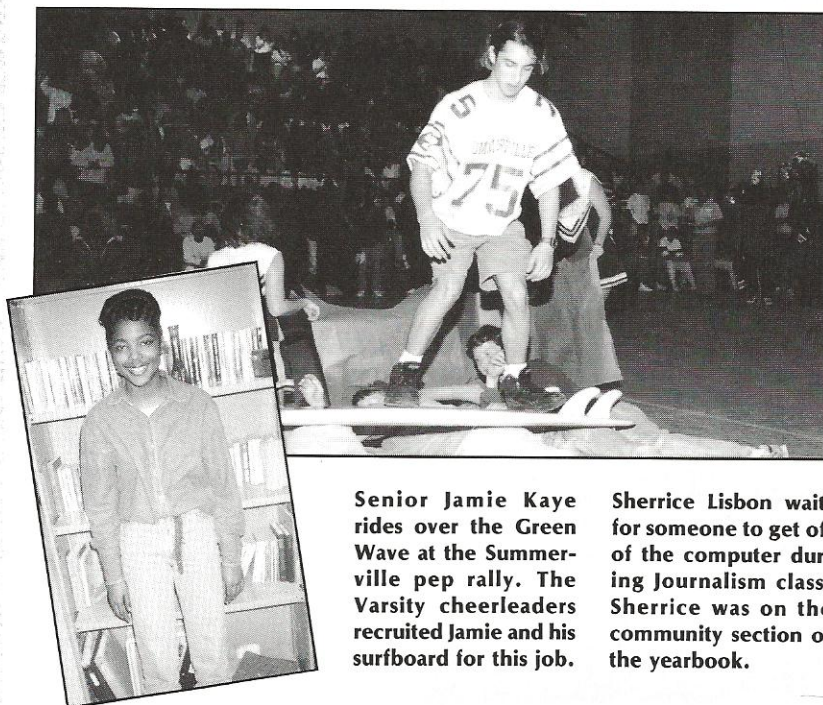
Seniors Jamie Kaye and Sherrice Lisbon were voted "Most Unique" by the class of 1993.
