The Dogs' winning streak continued unchallenged until the Dogs met the Goose Creek Gators. The Dogs held a last second Gator drive to

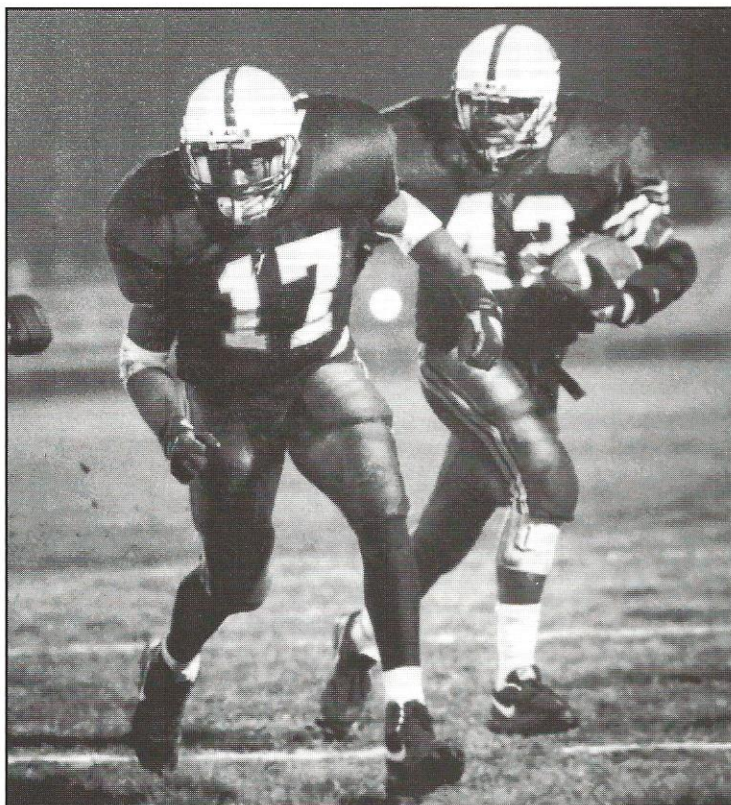
win the game 16-13.
