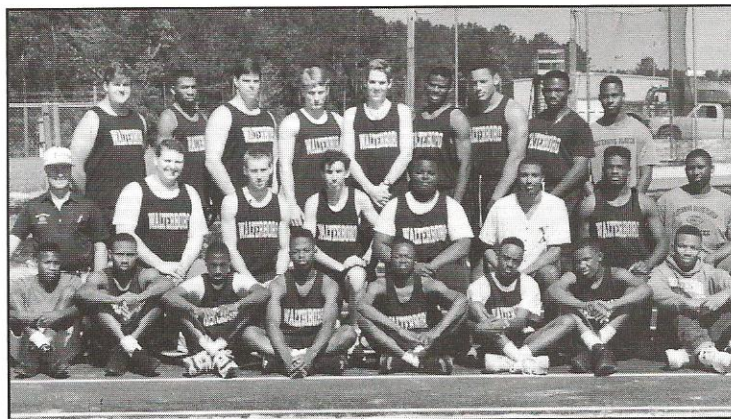
state track meet. Darwin, a sophomore, won the state title for shot put.
