Type face for the body copy throughout the book was 10pt. Century Schoolbook, and the captions were 8pt. Century Schoolbook. Caption leads were in 8pt. Century Schoolbook Bold. The type face for the headlines on the prologue and epilogue were set by Representative Steve Karelitz. Headlines for dividers were set by the plant in Alabama.

Student Life editor Karen Beach chose 120pt. and 42pt. Times Roman and 42pt. Brush for headlines. Academics editor Rhonda Carter used 36pt. Spartan Medium Italic and 36pt. Stencil for the "On Target." People editor Selena Taylor chose 42pt. Century Schoolbook for headlines, 10pt. Century Schoolbook Bold for senior names, and 6pt. Century Schoolbook for senior statistics. For underclassmen, she used 42pt. Century Schoolbook for headlines and 8pt. Century Schoolbook for names. Sports editor Kevin Crosby used 30pt. and 48pt.
