But Time

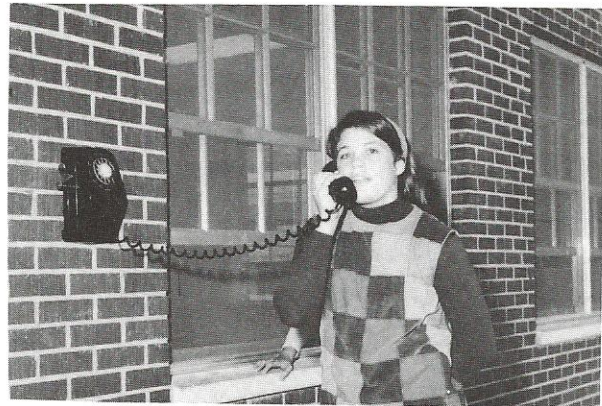
Though students spent a substantial amount of time in school, they also set aside time to be involved in “non-academic” activities.
