NEW PLAYERS MAY BRING MORE EXPERIENCE NEXT YEAR.

The girls varsity basketball team had a challenge ahead of them as they started the season. Due to the moving of several female athletes, there were only four returning from the 1993-94 team. Returning senior Tamesha Griffith and returning sophomore Ashley Whetsell helped to control the boards on both the offense and defense by gaining a total of 299 rebounds and averaging 5 points per game each, according to Coach Marsha Coe. 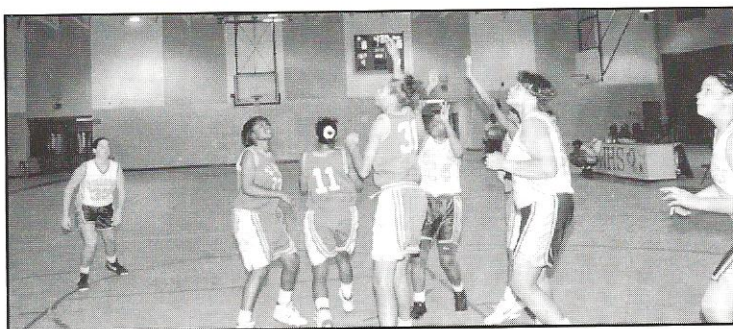
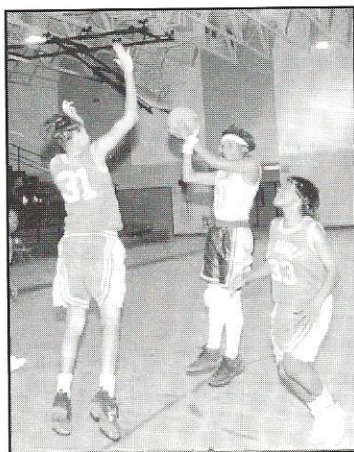
