Scholarships were given to students on the basis of need and/or academic merit. Private foundations and educational institutions distributed these awards to high school students who fit the specific criteria.

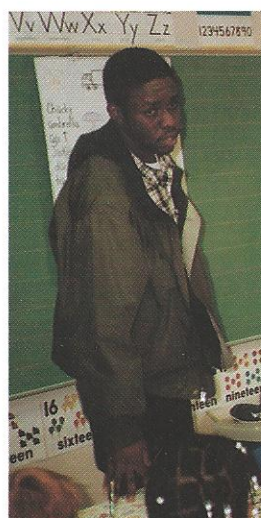
With the help of the school library and the guidance department, students searched for ways to finance their college education. Each student had to take the initiative to find these sources and put information into use.
