
"It was great to see the young men put forth the effort to be and work as a team," said line coach Micheal Ritter.

Although the Pups went on to lose to Stratford, their morale did not fall.


"Losing only made us want to go out there and win," said Robert Brown, who doubled as the fullback and the cornerback.

"After we tightened up all the mistakes made in that game, we were ready for the game against Goose Creek," said tight-end Maurice Singleton.


Although Walterboro did not beat its all-time rival, Summer-ville, the season was good.
